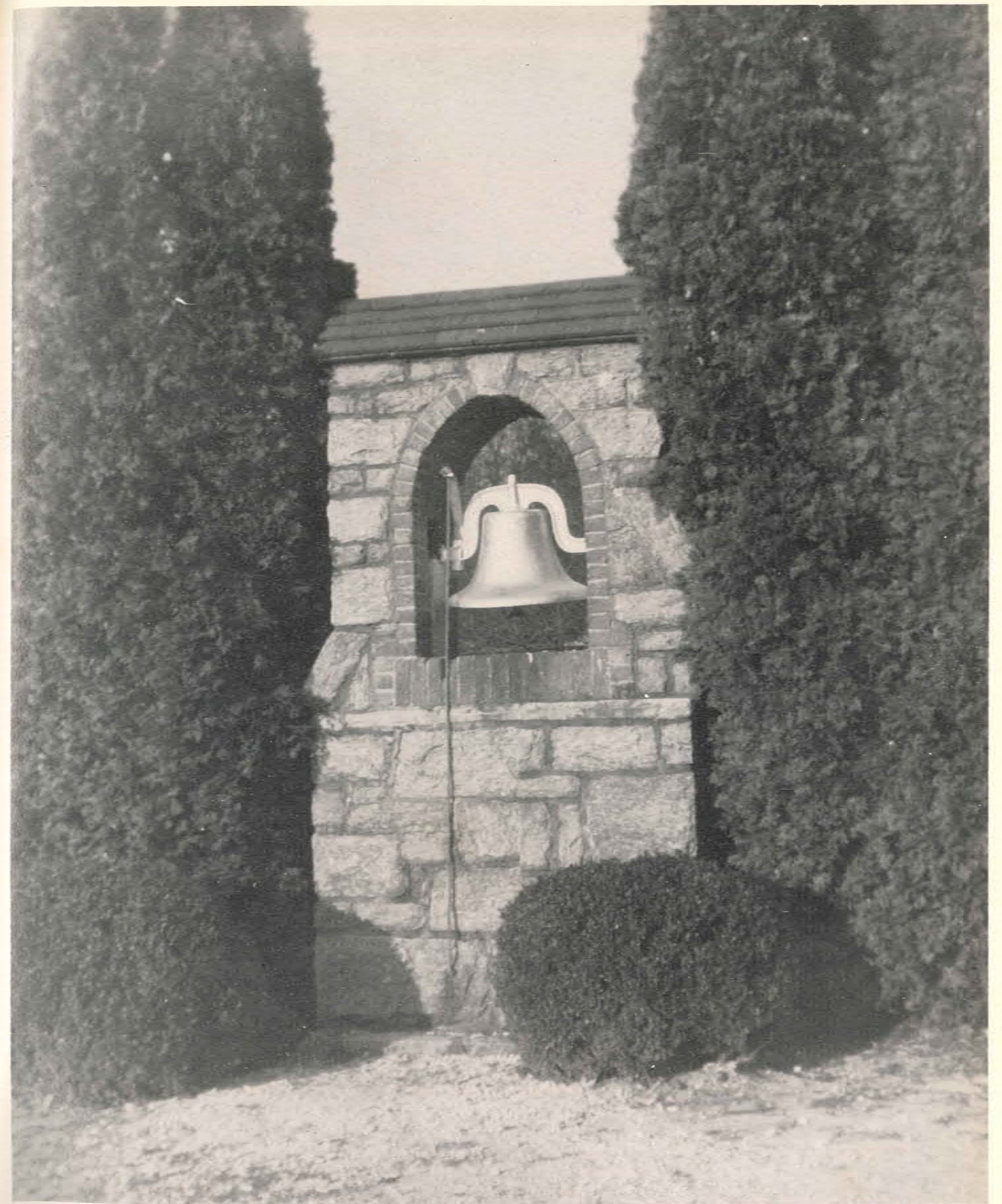

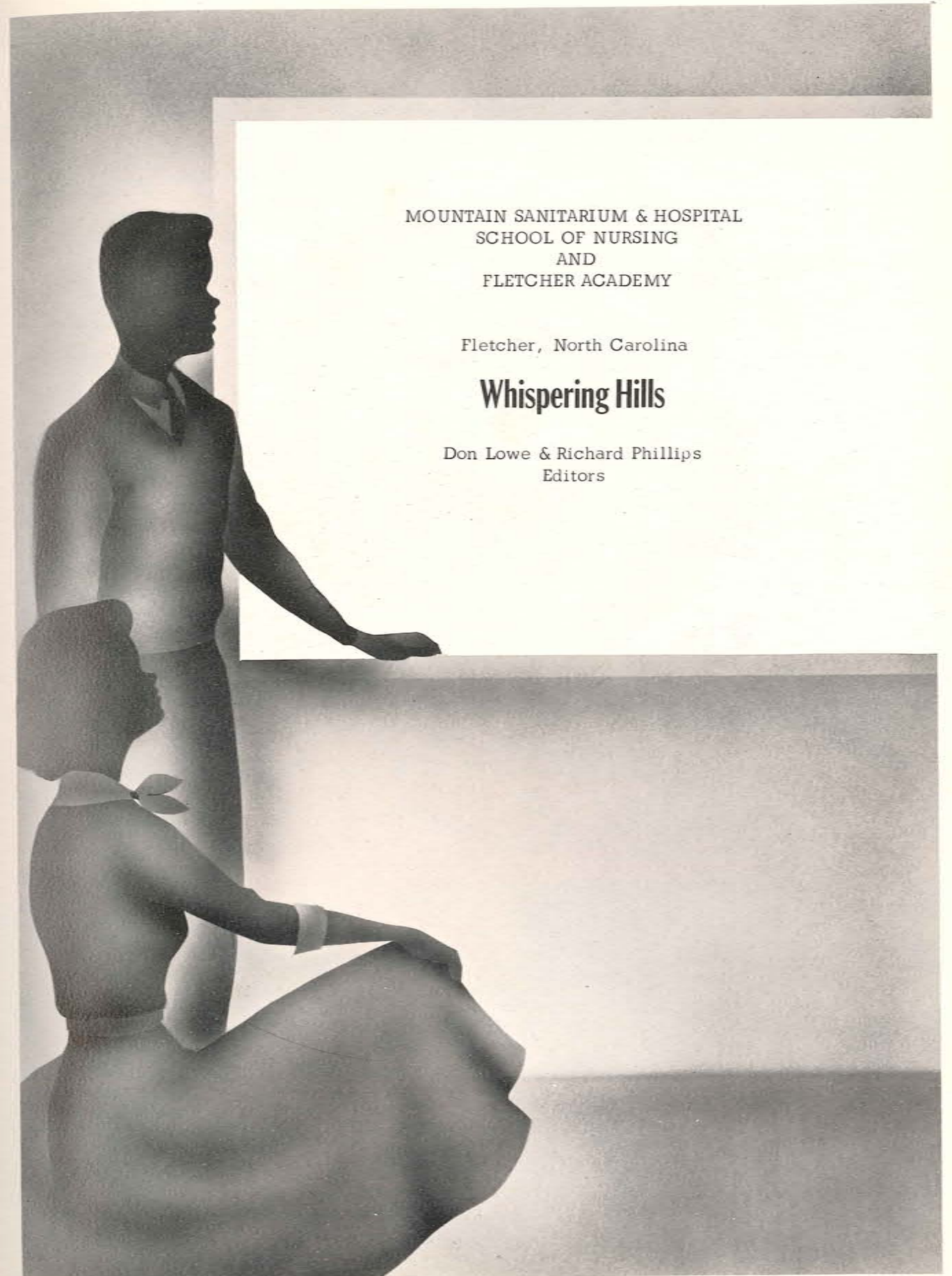

This year the Mountain Sanitarium and Fletcher Academy will be celebrating their Golden Anniversary. Like most other things, this institution had a small and humble beginning. Fifty years ago takes us back to 1909 and 1910. Just prior to the purchase of the property there was living in Asheville a Mrs. Martha Rumbough. The Rumbough family was quite a prominent family in Asheville and Western North Carolina. Her son is still living and two or three years ago he donated to the school library a number of his mother's books. Mrs. Rumbough was a dedicated church worker who was anxious that a share of her income be used for some project that would be helpful to the people in this part of the country as well as a memorial to her family. Mrs. E. G. White personally advised and encouraged Mrs. Rumbough in this project. In making her selection Mrs. Rumbough worked through her local church and the final result was the purchase of the original property on which the school now stands. The original tract of land was known as the Byers place and was purchased for \$5,000. Professor Arthur Spaulding, pioneer, author and educator in the SDA Church located the property and approved the final selection. Another pioneer educator helping in the establishment of the institution was Professor Sidney Brownsberger, first president of Battle Creek College. Dr. John Brownsberger, son of Prof. Brownsberger, had much to do with the establishment of the medical work in later years. The few pictures taken dating back to the time the property was purchased indicate an old run-down, worn out plantation. The last of the original buildings, the old "Big House," used for so many years for a girls' home and dining hall, burned several years ago. The first class rooms were also located in the "Big House" when the school was first started. Later they were moved to a little two room building directly across the road and still later to their present location - in the chapel building. At the time the institution was incorporated, it was dedicated as a health and educational institution.

The medical work began in a little four room building, part of the present patients' parlor. Here health treatments were given and sound principles of health taught. About the same time a small school for elementary children was started. From that small beginning it has developed into what it is today. For many years the institution operated the Good Health Place in Asheville. Connected with the work at the Good Health Place and operated for a number of years was the first cafeteria in the City of Asheville. About 1920 high school work was offered for the first time for the community and boarding students. Pioneering the way in this work of education on the higher level was Mr. and Mrs. A. A. Jaspersen. Mrs. Jaspersen retired as principal of the academy and he as president of the institution in 1952. Mrs. Jaspersen was succeeded by one of her faithful teachers, Prof. Lewis E. Nestell, our present principal. In 1929 the Nurses Training School was established and has been training registered nurses each year since that time. Miss Lelia Patterson, who is still with us today, helped to pioneer the medical work and also helped with the Nurses Training School. Mrs. John Brownsberger and Mrs. Gladys Lowder were also pioneers in the nursing education field. These ladies deserve much credit for their wonderful work in the training of Christian nurses. By 1931 there was a well-established medical and educational institution here. In this same year the 11th grade was added to the high school. In 1935 the high school became a full-fledged senior boarding academy. This work was accredited and approved by the State in 1938 or 1939. Since 1935 the Academy has graduated approximately 500 students, many of whom are now holding positions of trust and responsibility in various places throughout the world. In addition to the work that is being done today in caring for the sick there are three schools on the campus--the elementary school with approximately 80 children, the boarding academy of 140 students and the Nurses Training School with 40 students. In visiting our campus, our buildings, our farm or wherever you go you will find young people. The goal of our three schools is to educate the hand, the heart and the mind that our young people may be trained for Christian Service.
