A visit to Duke after graduation brought that dreaded word, leukemia, out into the open, and from that day on John fought a valiant battle that was finally ended April 14, 1960, just eighteen days after his nineteenth birthday.

## In Memoriam

In 1939 Miss Carolyn Marquis, affectionately known as "Aunt Carolyn," came to make Fletcher her home. Her twenty-one years with our school family since that time have been filled with faithful work sprinkles of laughter, much love, and daily devotion. On January 13, 1961, her life was suddenly ended when she suffered a heart attack. There was no time for good-by. Words from Lucy Larcomb's poem, "In The World With You", would express, we believe, Aunt Carolyn's philosophy of life while here:

"I am glad that I live(d) in the world with you!"

And tomorrow when we meet again we shall answer her, "We are glad that we lived in the world with you."



#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Youth of Fletcher:

A long time ago a man by the name of Bacon said, "Knowledge is Power." There has been plenty of evidence since then to show that his statement is true. Because of this, education has built its temple on this foundation. One thing, however, he failed to say about knowledge--that is, what kind of power is it? Knowledge and skill in the hand of the surgeon save life; knowledge and skill in the hand of the knave, fool, or the unprincipled endanger life.

The greatest benefactors of mankind, past or present, as well as its greatest reprobates, have not been ignorant men. Long before the time of Bacon, trouble started in a place called Eden when man accepted the "tree of knowledge" in the place of the "tree of life." Could it be that man today, with his burdens, afflictions, fears, and problems, has made the same mistake? Recently I ran across this statement made by General Omar Bradley, "We have too many men of science. too few men of God. We have grasped the mystery of the atom and rejected the sermon on the mount...The world has achieved brilliance without wisdom, power without conscience. Ours is a world of nuclear giants and ethical infants. We know more about war than we know about peace, more about killing than we know about living."

Long before the time of General Bradley, a man by the name of Jeremiah wrote, "Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches: But let him that glorieth glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the Lord who exerciseth lovingkindness, justice, and righteousness, in the earth: For in these things I delight, saith the Lord," Jeremiah 9: 23,24.
