







Foreword


For these and many more deeds of thoughtfulness we the nursing students proudly dedicate our 1961 "Whispering Hills" to you.

In 1939 Miss Carolyn Marquis. affectionately known as "Aunt Carolyn," came to make Fletcher her home. Her twenty-one years with our school family since that time have been filled with faithful work sprinkles of laughter, much love, and daily devotion. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Youth of Fletcher:

A long time ago a man by the name of Bacon said, "Knowledge is Power." There has been plenty of evidence since then to show that his statement is true. Because of this, education has built its temple on this foundation. One thing, however, he failed to say about knowledge—that is, what kind of power is it? Knowledge and skill in the hand of the surgeon save life; knowledge and skill in the hand of the knave, fool, or the unprincipled endanger life.

The greatest benefactors of mankind, past or present, as well as its greatest reprobates, have not been ignorant men. Long before the time of Bacon, trouble started in a place called Eden when man accepted the "tree of knowledge" in the place of the "tree of life."
