"MEN WANTED"

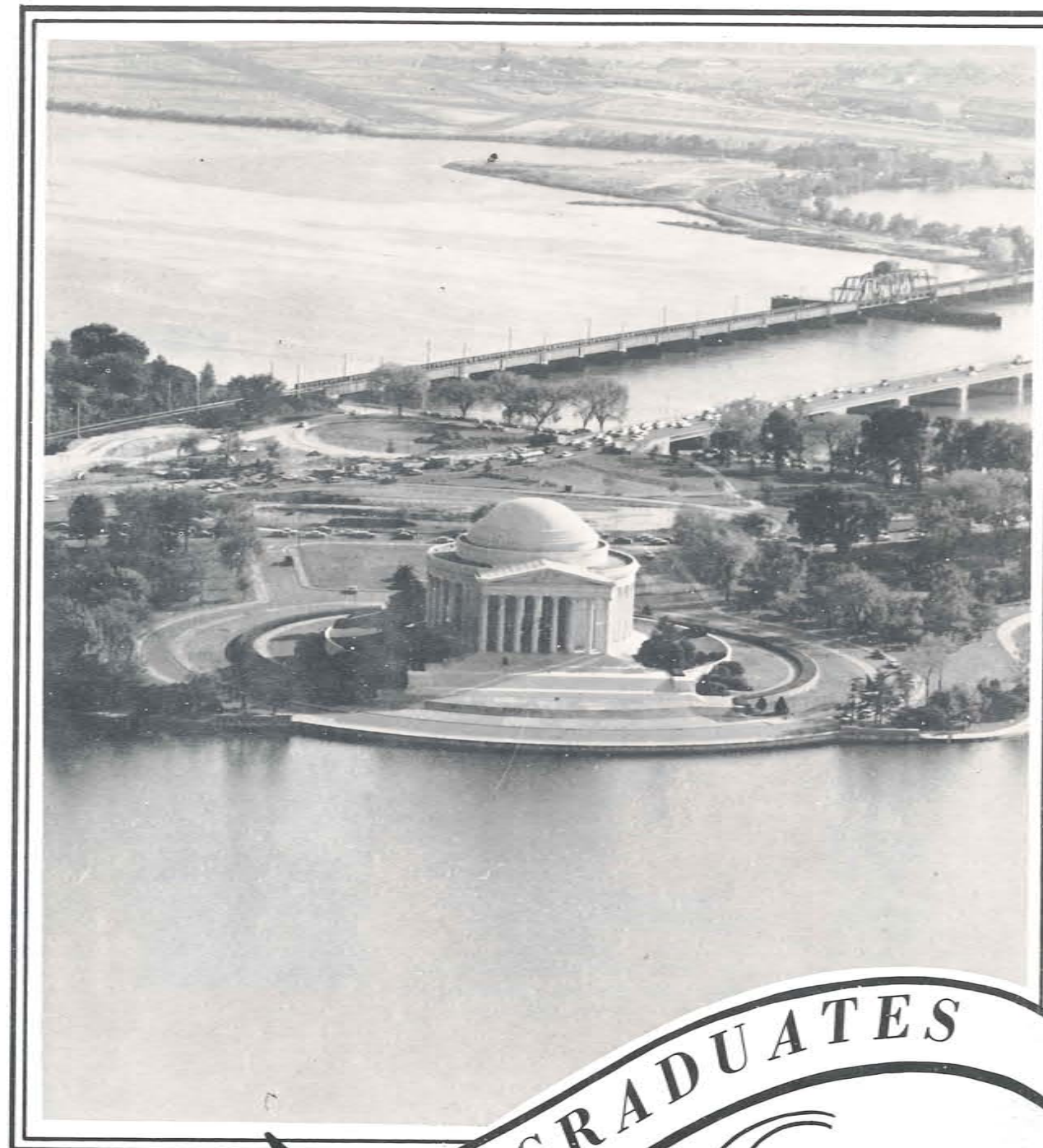

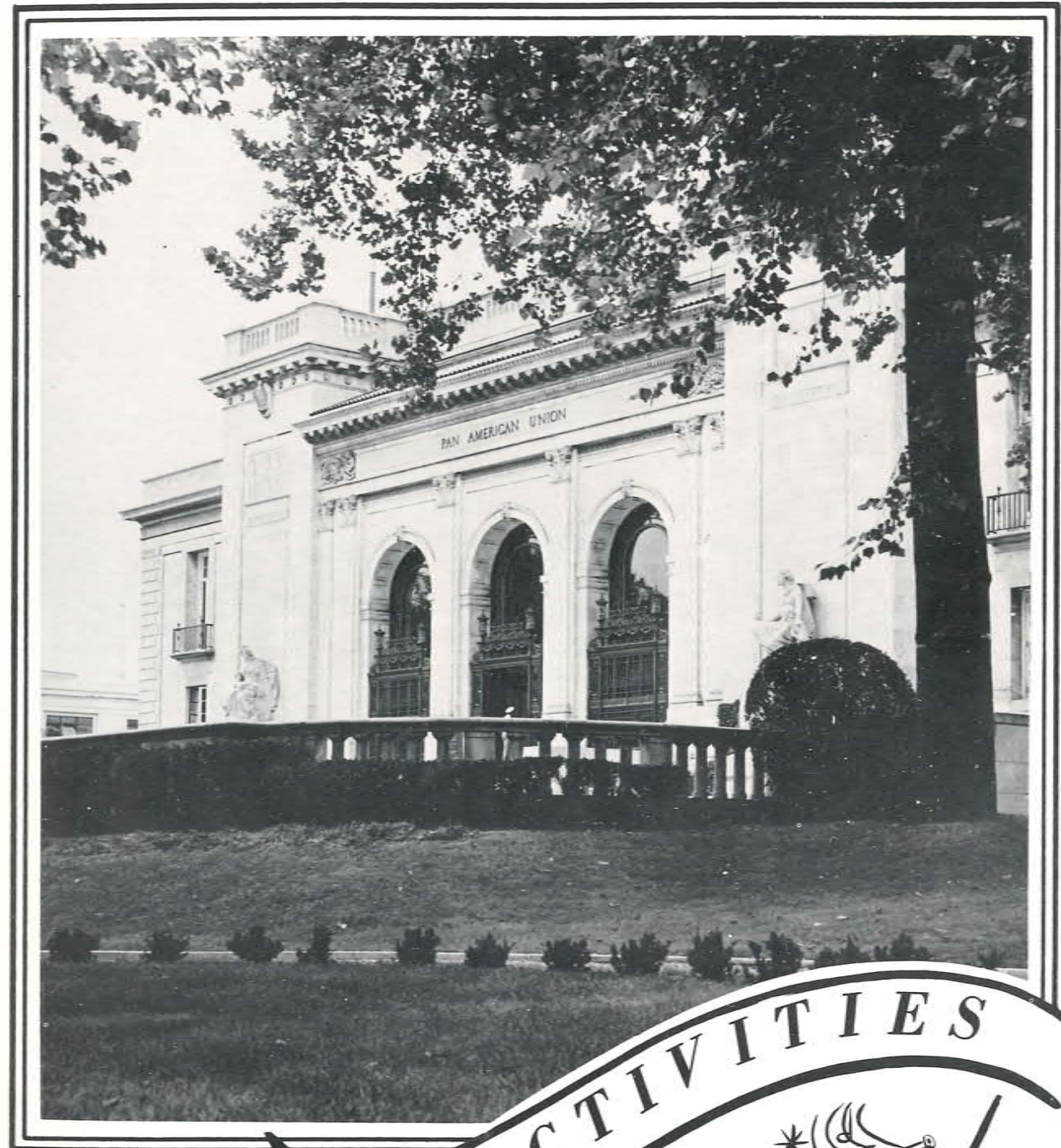

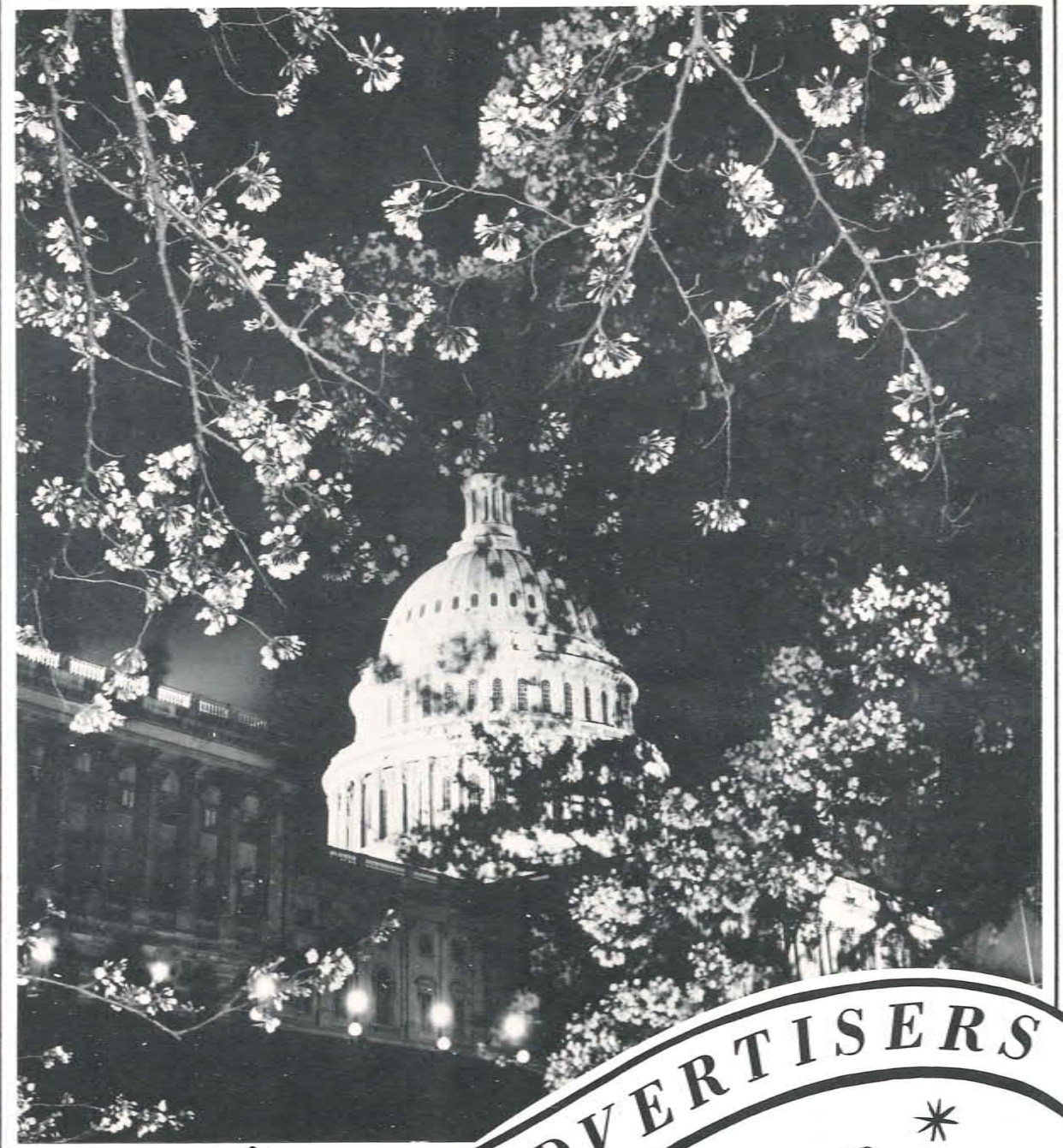




IN MEMORIAM

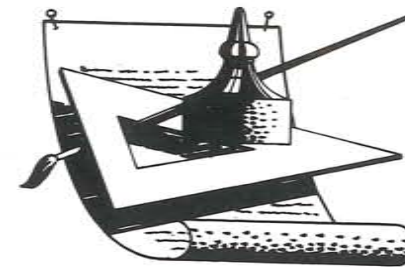
