The apostle Paul: "What mean ye to weep and break my heart; for I am ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus."

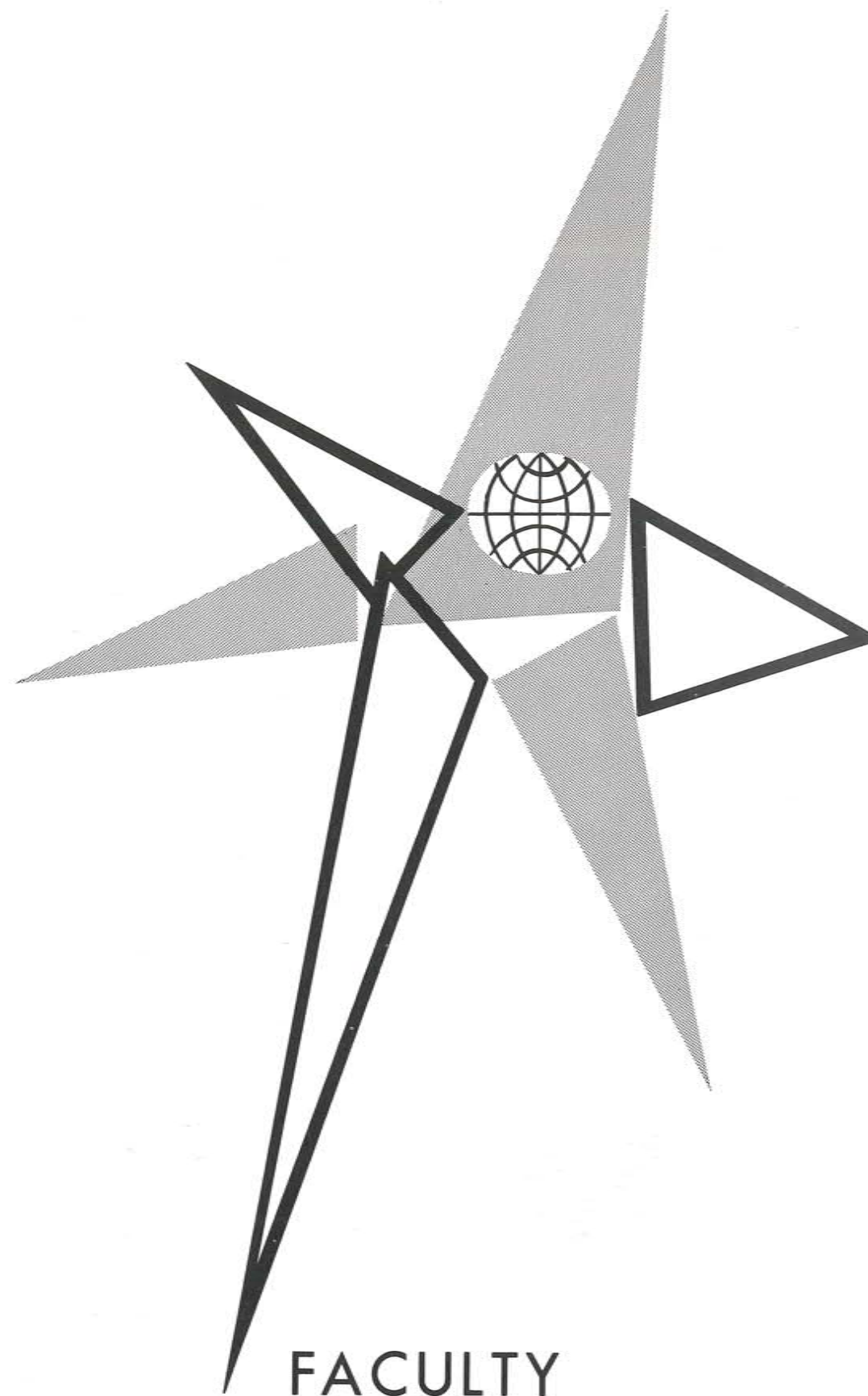
