A PERSONAL TRIBUTE

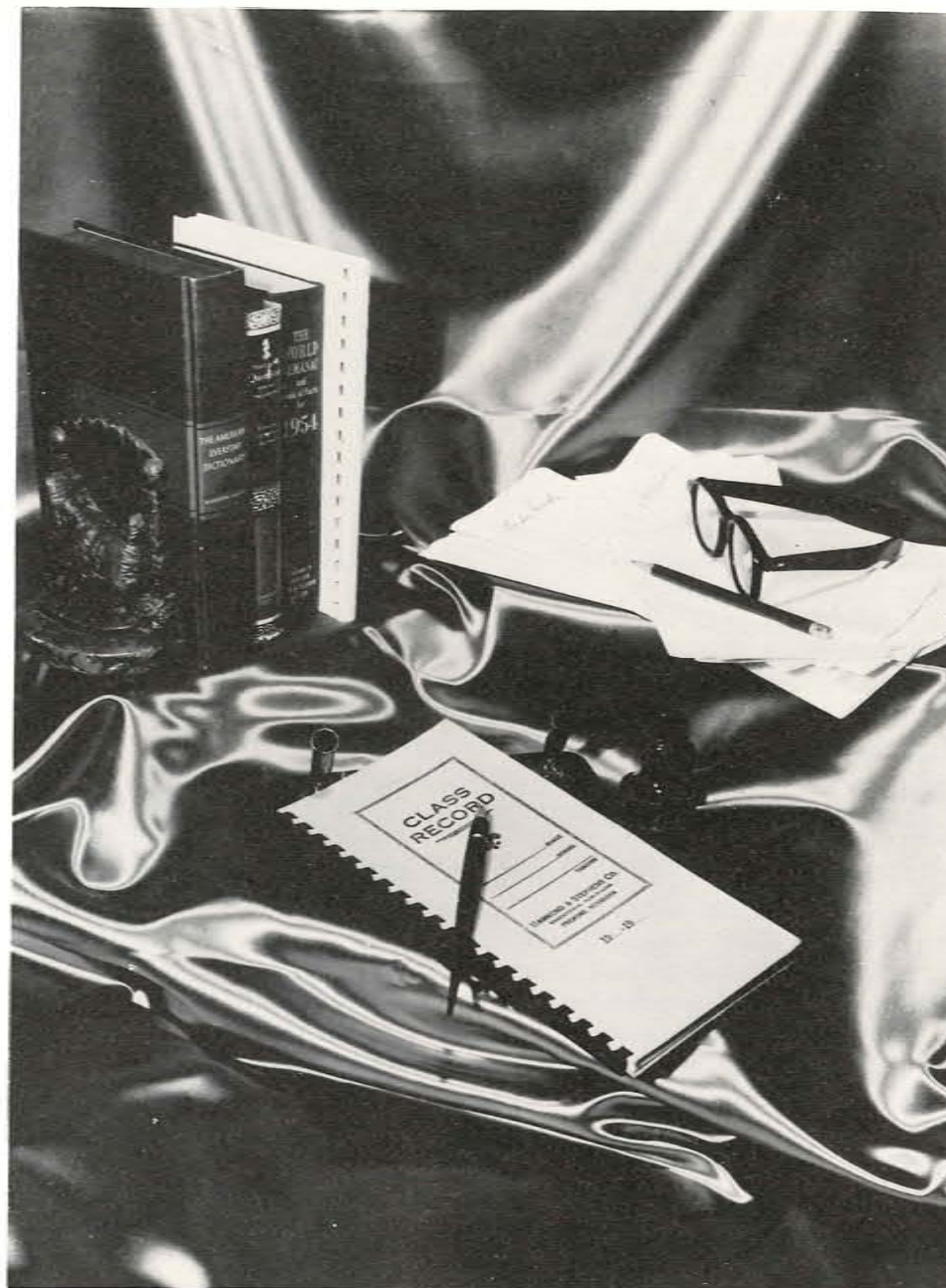
James Lewis was one of the pioneers in this institution. His years of service and sacrifice go back a long time before my arrival in the working force here. Beginning in 1931 and continuing up until the time of his death we worked together as part of a team. This was not a hop, skip, and jump affair but rather a day by day working relationship. For many years he was treasurer of the institution. Throughout most of his years he was farm manager. He was also a trained nurse.

There are people who get our attention by their spectacular gifts or their magnetic personalities. These are like the thunderstorm with its noise and lightning. Mr. Lewis was not of this type. He was more like the soft wind that fans your hot face or the gentle rain that gives promise of spring and planting time. I think he would like to be designated as a son of the soil. He loved the farm, gardens, orchards, and farm animals. Hundreds of men will remember him as a kind and friendly farm boss.

But more than all these, he was a Christian gentleman. In all my years I never knew him to lose his temper or to speak evil of another. His word was as good as his bond. His cautious approach to problems was something we younger administrators needed.

So I miss him as a neighbor, fellow worker, church member, and friend. I miss his friendly counsel, his keen sense of humor, and his good example. I miss him like the sudden non-ticking of a kitchen clock. I miss him like the shade of a friendly tree when I work in the sun. I miss him like one would miss his team mate while playing a game. Workers, students, and neighbors--we all miss "Uncle Jimmy".

You and I live in a jet age. Youth tend to admire speed in almost any form, but especially in the form of such things as fast ships, trains, planes, and cars. Along with this tendency to admire and worship speed, there is a tendency to think that if a thing is fast, it must be good and desirable. This, however, might be one of those dangerous half-truths that has brought so much trouble into our world. While we admire fast cars, we tend to forget that speed is our biggest killer on the highways. One of the by-products of this speed age is the growing characteristic, impatience. We cannot wait to complete a good preparation for life, chew our food properly, get married, read a good book, wait for the apples to get ripe, meditate, pray, or be neighborly.

The Good Book states that the race doesn't always go to the swift nor the battle to the strong. Recently I was riding on one of those modern super DC eights. It was big. It was strong. It was swift. We flew about seven miles high at speeds approaching sound. It didn't take long to travel from New York to Istanbul, Turkey. How much did we see of the ocean, of London, of Paris, the Alps, Geneva, or Rome? We didn't see very much. It is true we reached our destination in record time, but we missed things on the way. Here is a little prayer worth thinking about:

"Slow me down, Lord! Ease the pounding of my heart by the quieting of my mind. Steady my hurried pace with a vision of the eternal reach of time. Give me, amid the confusion of my day, the calmness of the everlasting hills. Break the tensions of my nerves and muscles with the soothing music of the singing streams that live in my memory.

Help me to know the magical, restoring power of the Sabbath. Teach me the art of taking five minute vacations. . . of slowing down to look at a flower, to chat with a friend, to pat a dog, to read a few lines from a good book. Remind me each day of the fable of the hare and the tortoise, that I may know that the race is not always to the swift; that there is more to life than increasing its speed.

Let me look upward into the branches of the towering oak and know that it grew great and strong because it grew slowly and well. Slow me down, Lord, and inspire me to send my roots deep into the soil of life's enduring values that I may grow toward the stars of my greater destiny. Amen."

Let me urge you to take time to see the trees, the sunsets, the sky, children, your friends, the handiwork of God, to worship, to read a good book, to pray, and to meditate. Without these special times the distance between you and your final destination may be one barren of interest. How can one plan to enjoy the pleasures of eternity when he does not know how to spend a Sabbath afternoon by himself?
