

That the passage of time may pover dim our allegiance to God, to Country.


That the passage of time may never dim our allegiance to God, to Country, or to our School, is the wish of the Whispering Hills Staff of 1970.

Arthur A. Jasperson November 5, 1887--January 25, 1969

Former President of Fletcher Academy and Mountain Sanitarium; Former President of Madison College

Hundreds of young people, and adult friends throughout the nation and the world were saddened by the death of Mr. Arthur A. Jasperson. To many of these he was known as "Papa J" a term of affection and respect. Since his retirement from the Presidency of Madison College, Mr. Jasperson had been living at his home on the Madison College Campus. His retirement years, even up to the very last, were active years.

There are brilliant men who light the world up around them like a rocket in the night, but seem to leave the world a little darker in their passing. There are other men, who are wise and thoughtful, whose passing leaves not only a vacancy in memory, but a soft afterglow in the human heart. The best of men, like the best of tools, need to be chosen on the basis of what work they can do, and how long they will wear. Mr. Jasperson met both these counts well. The Institution at

Fletcher is largely a living monument to his leadership. That he wore well is evidenced by his long service record.

My first contact with the Jaspersons came through correspondence, which culminated in 21 years of teamwork, and nearly 40 years of friendship. To me Mr. Jasperson became more than a fellow-worker, he became a close friend and understanding older brother.

To a good entertainer - on the road - in camp - in his home



Dr. And Mrs. John F. Brownsberger Honored

John Brownsberger first came to Fletcher in 1910 as a teen-age boy. He was the son of Professor Sydney Brownsberger, Ph.D., a prominent SDA educator who had become the first president of the denomination's first college at Battle Creek. His wife Edith had been a sec-

retary to the prominent church leader Ellen G. White.

Professor Brownsberger had responded to an appeal from Mrs. White to start a medical and educational work near Asheville, North Carolina. A year before, Mrs. White had been the guest of a well-to-do resident of that city, Martha Rumbough. She had persuaded Mrs. Rumbough that the Lord would be pleased to have such an institution started. Mrs. Rumbough responded by purchasing a run-down farm of some 400 acres. The old plantation house became the first residence, school, and administration building.

John and the other two Brownsberger children, Sydney, Jr. and Ethel, worked hard to help their distinguished parents make their dream a reality. John felled trees, drove mules and hoed corn, and helped build the first small two-room sanitarium. All three children were to become physicians. Sydney would become an eye surgeon of great prominence, and Ethel a

well-known pediatrician in the nearby Biltmore area.

John returned to Fletcher in 1929 with his wife Elsie, a registered nurse, and two daughters, Barbara and Edith. Barbara also became a nurse, writer and reviser of nursing textbooks. Edith suffered an untimely and tragic death by accidental poisoning when only three

years old.

Upon his return John found a small but flourishing sanitarium under the direction of Lelia Patterson, R.N., who, now retired, makes her home on the institutional campus. John soon started a small but well-equipped surgery unit. However, he did not confine his work to the practice of surgery; he kept the small sanitarium full to overflowing, and even placed patients in nearby homes. He also built up his out-patient clientele to some three thousand persons. He made house calls day and night, and once a week conducted a free clinic day for patients unable to pay. Such hard work caused the struggling young institution to prosper, and a decade later a new hospital building was erected, with a substantial portion of the required means coming from Dr. Brownsberger's own pocket.

During the year of their arrival his wife Elsie was equally busy. She saw the need for more nurses in the area and immediately set about to organize a nursing school. Annie Witt and Gladys Lowder were in the first nursing class. Mrs. Lowder was later to become director of nurses, and Mrs. Witt hospital supervisor and Dr. Brownsberger's nurse-receptionist.

Dr. Forrest Bliss soon joined the staff, and the two men were closely associated in the ensuing years. Later Dr. Brownsberger was called to the denominational headquarters in Washington, D.C., and there became chief surgeon. He acquired every degree possible in his specialty and has had an extensive write-up in the book WHO'S WHO IN AMERICAN SURGERY.

On November 23, 1969 the Brownsbergers were honored by having the recently built acute care hospital named in their honor. The dedication was followed by a testimonial dinner attended by some 200 friends and former associates. To this honor the WHISPERING HILLS staff of 1970 extend our appreciation to the Brownsbergers, who did so much to establish this institution.




