Pastor's Message



From its inception the Seventh-day Adventist Church embraced and proclaimed the doctrine of Christ's second coming. Whether it faced adversity or prosperity, whether it received ridicule or praise, whether it experienced decline or growth, made no difference. The doctrine of the second advent of Christ was, and it continues to be, the blessed hope of the church.


Today, we recognize that many Christians no longer affirm this New Testament teaching, and they are inclined to speak contemptuously of those who do. In the face of such scorn you might be tempted to compromise or even abandon your faith altogeher. That would truly be a tragedy! Those who turn their backs on the truth experience little peace and satisfaction, for they know that they no longer have a future bright with promise. How much better it would be to stand firm for the truth, to resist the ridicule of secular Christians, and to ride out the storm of opposition without faltering and without fear! Should this be your desire, you will want to examine yourself now and determine whither the second advent of Christ is the blessed hope by which you live, or a doctrine which you agree to but which has little impact on your life.

If you embrace the second advent of Christ as the blessed hope, then you will doutless plan and prepare for that event. You will center your affections on heaven or on the new earth rather than on the things of this world. Of course, we recognize that we still must earn a living, and that education holds the key to meaningful employment. But there is one major difference between the Adventist and the secularist: the Adventist sees money as a means toward the end of planning and preparing for the future and not as an end in itself. Therefore his goal is to use money to prepare for the coming kingdom of Christ and not to save money in order to be wealthy. The secularist thinks of self-advancement and pleasure in this life. When he does spend money, he usually spends it on material things, or invests it in order to increase his wealth. He has no concern to advance the gospel or to liberate, through the proclamation of God's Word, hundreds of thousands of persons in bondage to sin.

The blessed hope of the church, then has purging properties. If we allow it to burn within our hearts, we will experience the purifying power of the Holy Spirit as He endeavors to prepare us for the coming of Christ. May the Spirit of God illumine your understanding of the importance of this doctrine, purify your motives and aspirations, and strengthen your commitment to the church.
