Although you can get a good education and have a great time at Fletcher Academy, most of us are here because Fletcher is a Christ - centered school and we want to make Him a part of our lives.
















# Family


Almost half of our student body is made up of relatives. From sisters, brothers, brothers and sisters, and cousins, we've got 'em all! Life is so much better with them here.


