





In addition to the Christian education Fletcher stands for, we will remember the school and its traditions, and the friends we have share those memories with.







After a picnic style dinner in the cafe, the awards ceremony was held in the chapel. The class with the most points was the senior, followed by the junior, sophomore and fi-




On Wednesday afternoon, we set off for an undisclosed location in the Pisgah Forest. We took the rack bus to prepare us for this journey.

With everyone receiving such a blessing from their family groups, it will certainly become a Fletcher Academy tradition









