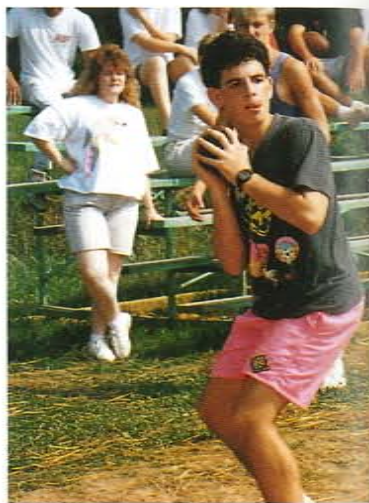

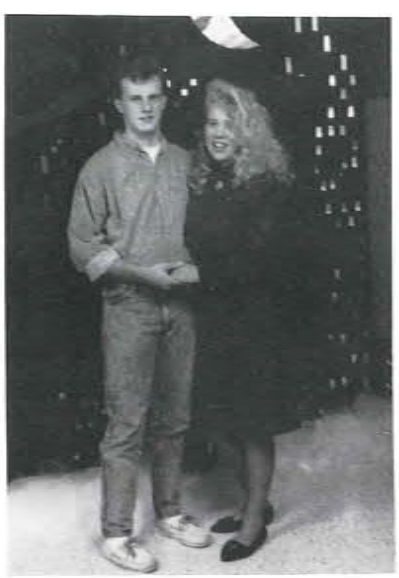
# HARVEST

We are the few freshmen, the class of '95, coming into a new setting. Quite unsure of the changes from being looked up to - to looking up to.

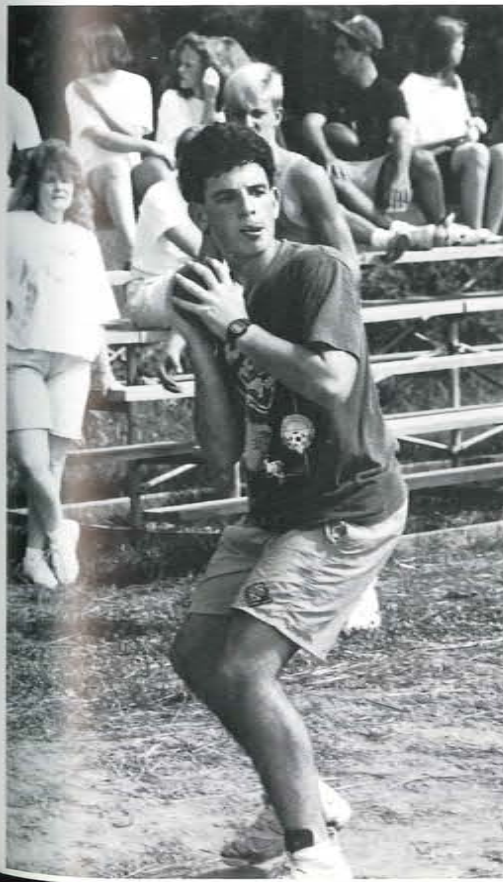
This year, the questions most asked are, "who are we", and "when will we stop being pinched"?

We had pressures, mistakes, new ideas, old ideas, no ideas, miles of laughs, buckets of tears, and hopefully, in the end, a diploma.

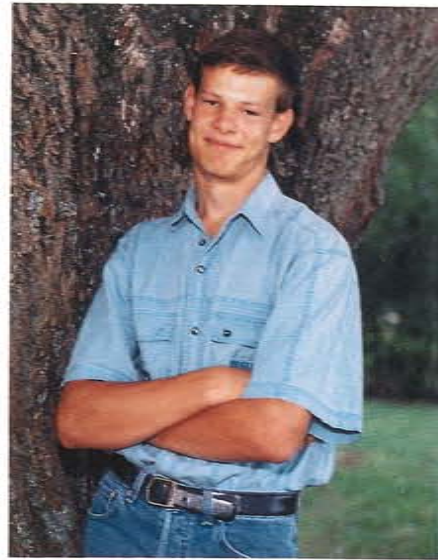
