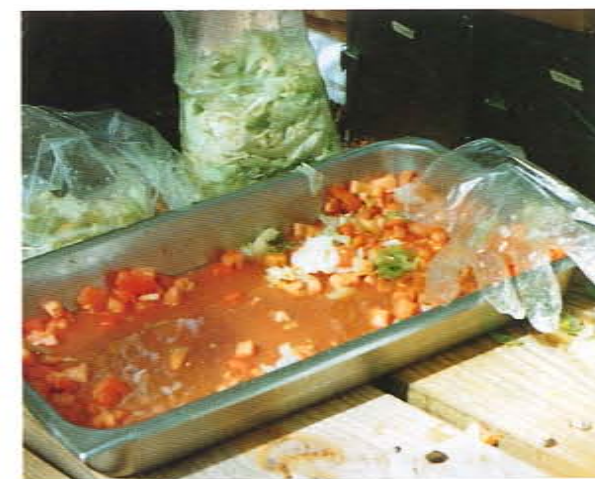

S.A. Harvest Party

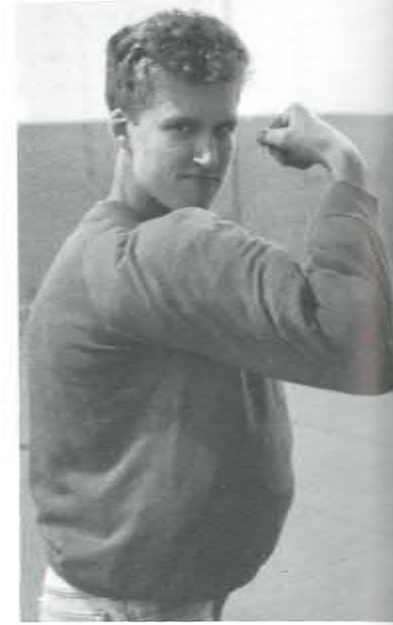

So we are finally sophomores, no longer just the "Few freshman class of 95". We are still underclassmen, but one step above the "Cute little freshmen" we were last year.

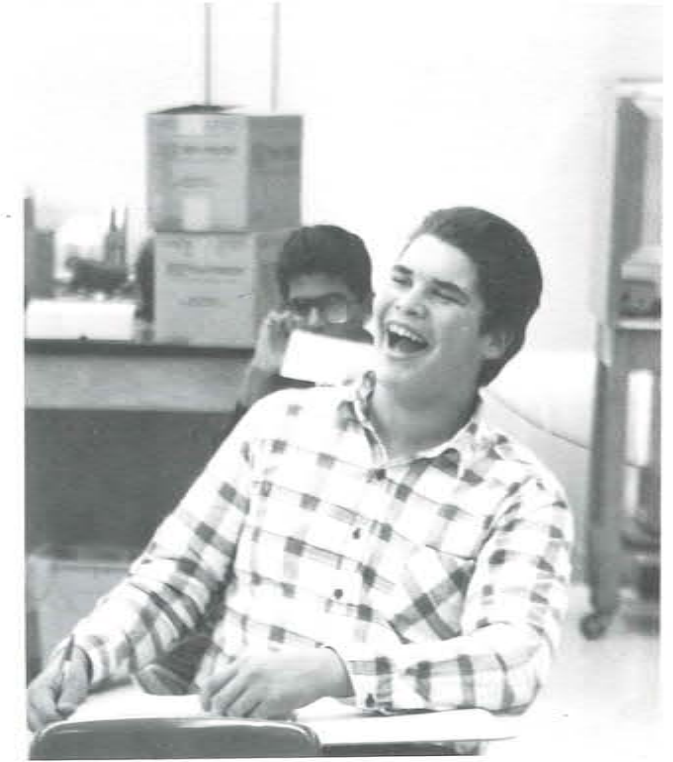
Before we were asked, "Who are you, where are you going and why are you here?" Honestly, many of us still have not found the answers to these questions.

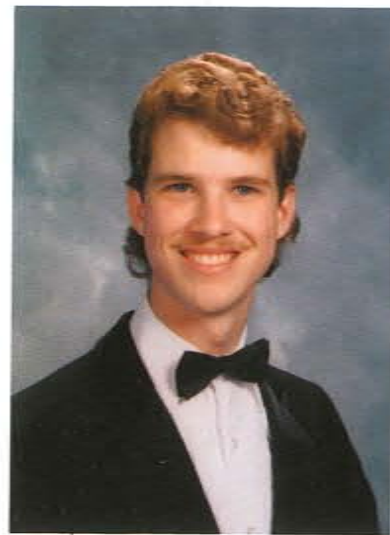


Survival
