
Dear Everybody,

I hope that everyone has an awesome summer & if you are coming back to Fletcher, I know that you are going to have a great next year!



























The SA Christmas Banquet






























Christmas Concert







SA Winter Olympics




Senior Presentation

And after all these things are his, add, I pray, enough of a sense of humor. So that he may always be serious, yet never take himself too seriously.



























Bible Conference
