As you share memories with your classmates, the memory, I pray, that stands out most, is the memory of meeting and experiencing Christ while attending Fletcher.

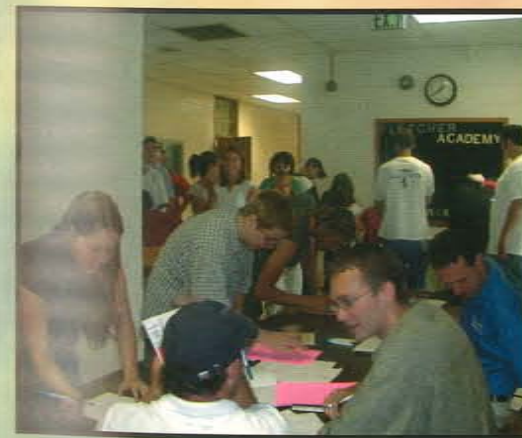
This event sounds a long way off, but will be here before you know it, unless Christ comes back first, and takes us to the best homecoming ever.

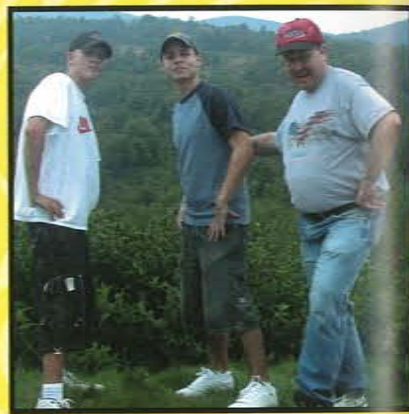
REGISTRATION & HANDSHAKE

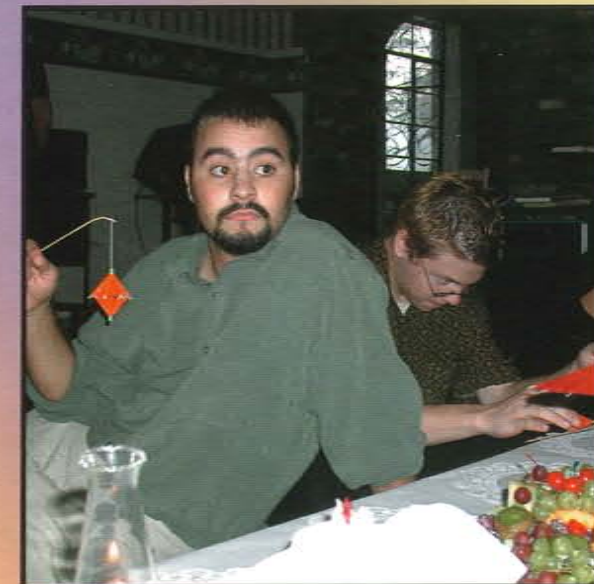
Apple Parade

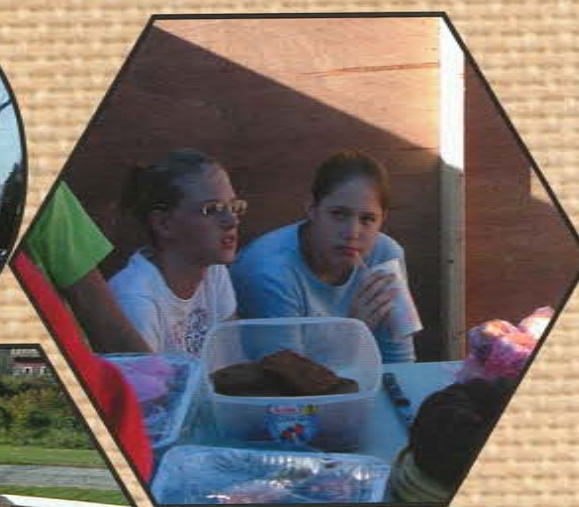
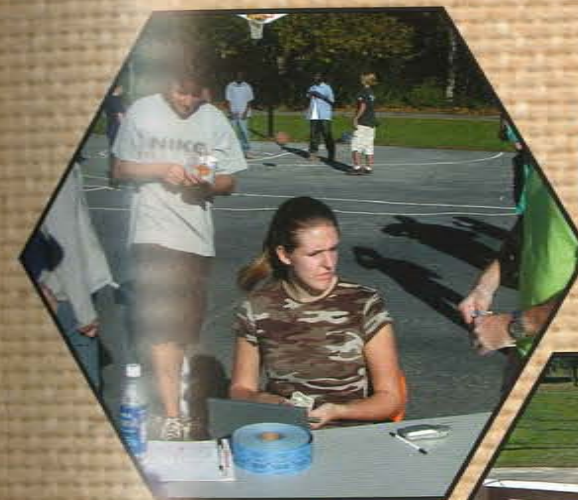
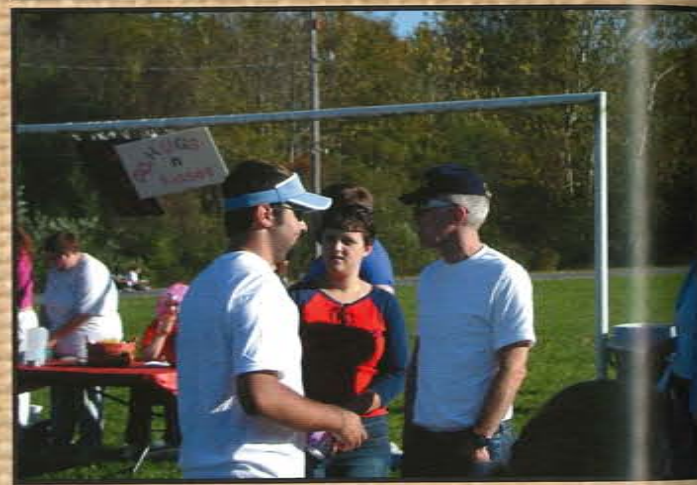
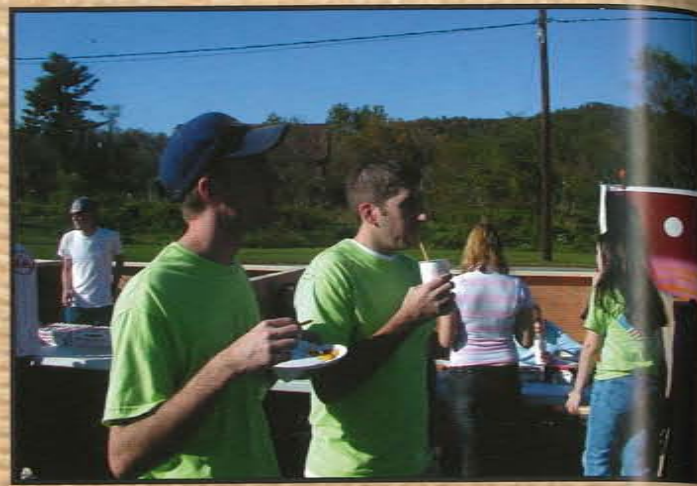
Alumni Weekend

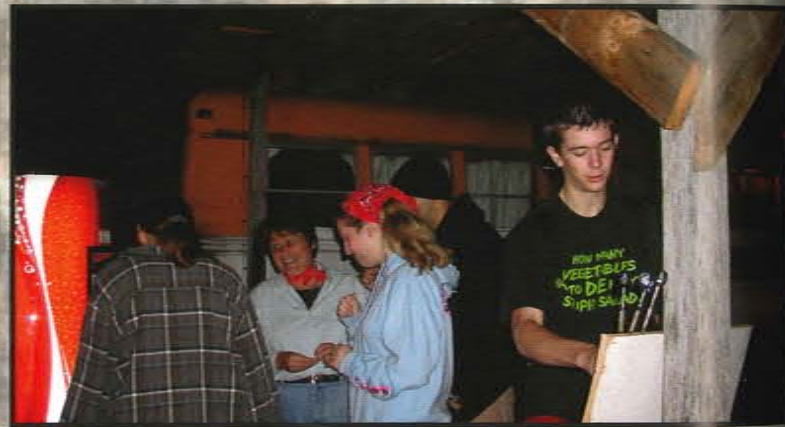
Fall Festival

Girls Club Banquet

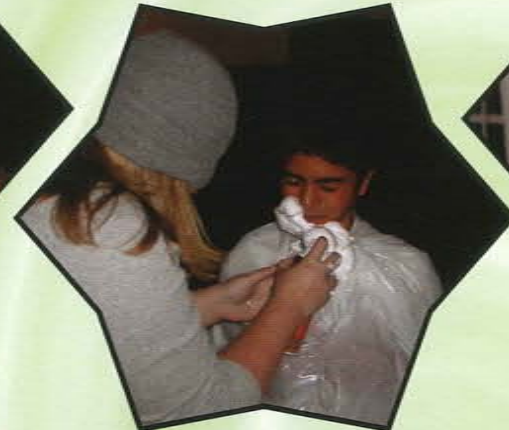

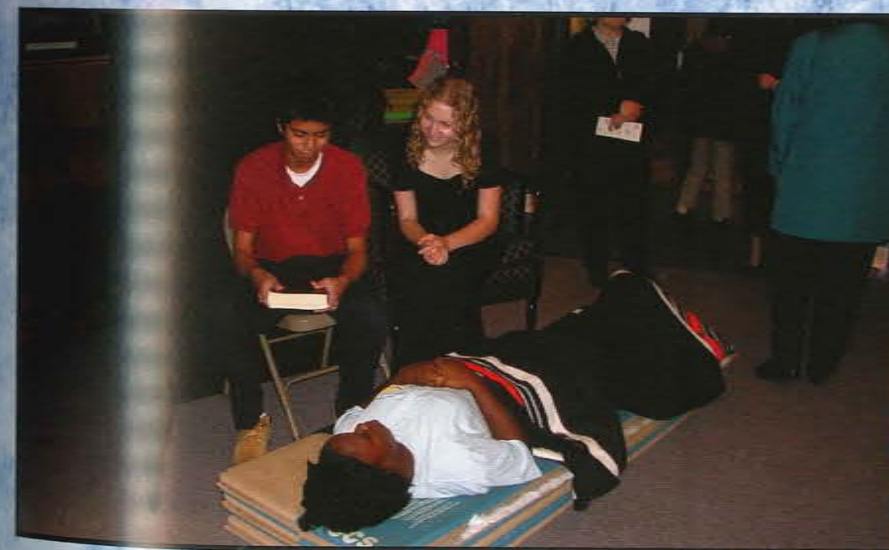
CHRISTMAS PARTY

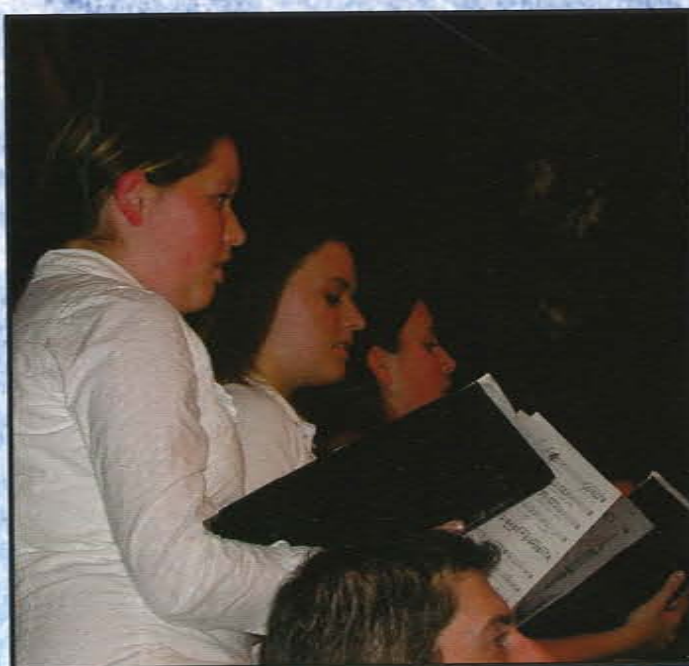
The Fourth Wiseman

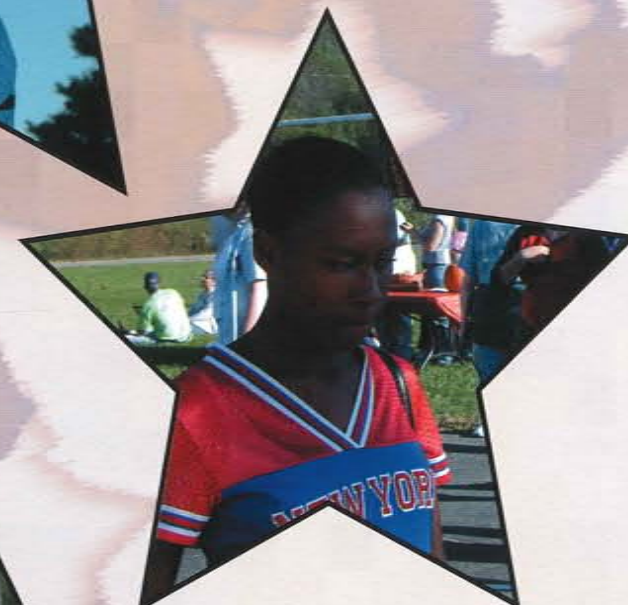
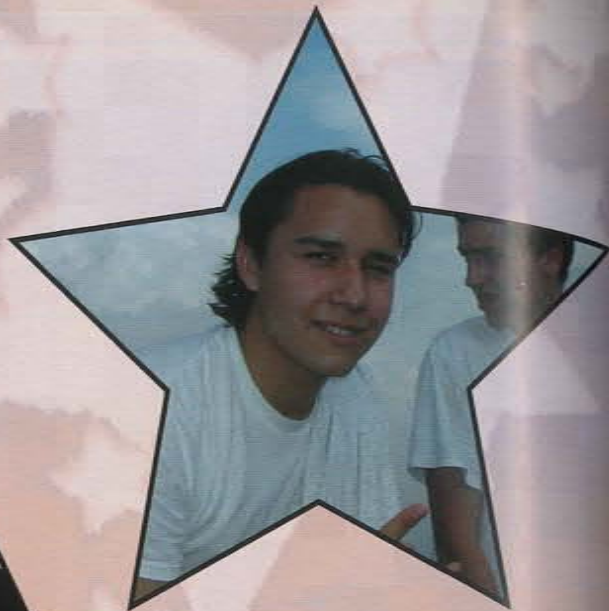
Christmas Concert

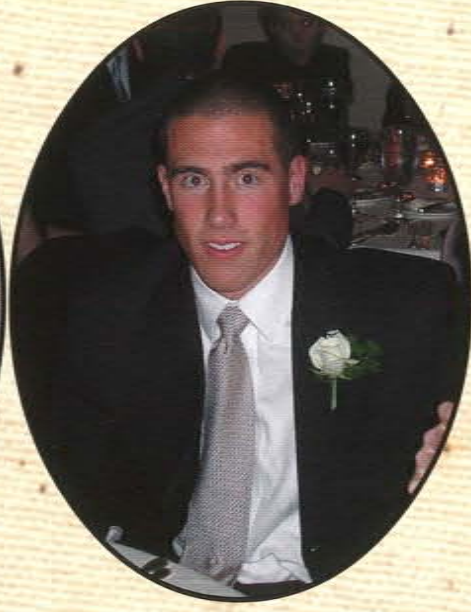
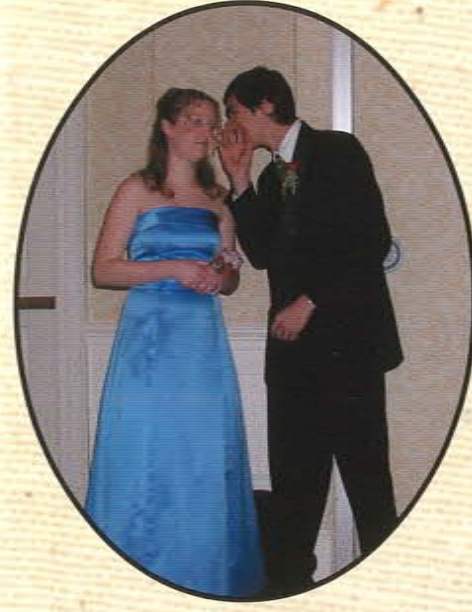
Honor Society

Mexico Mission Trip

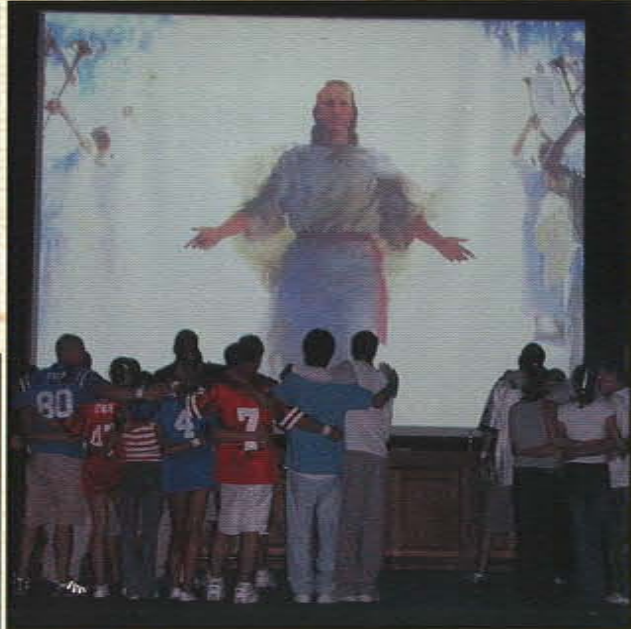
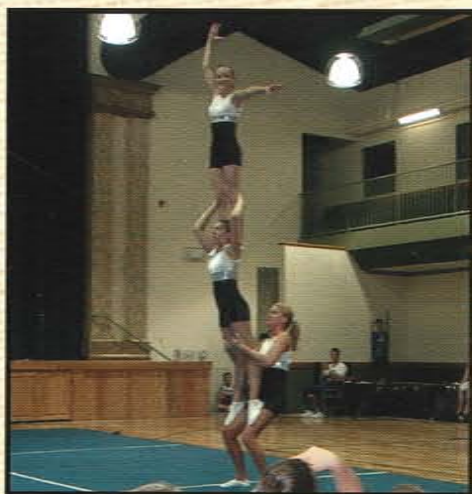
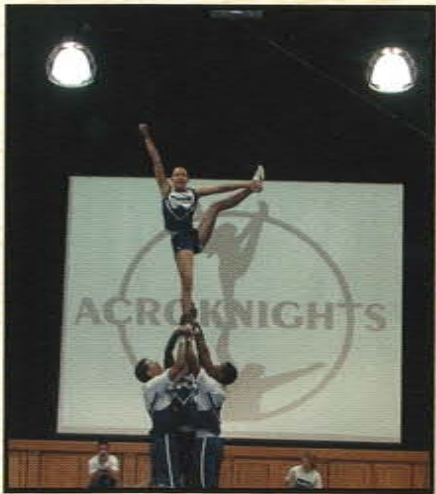
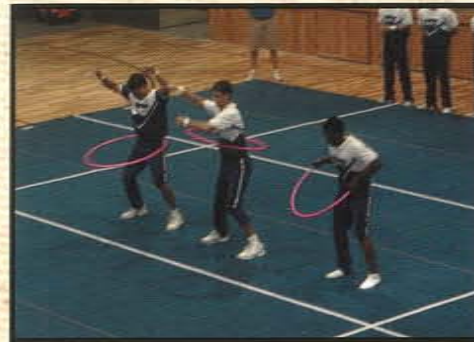

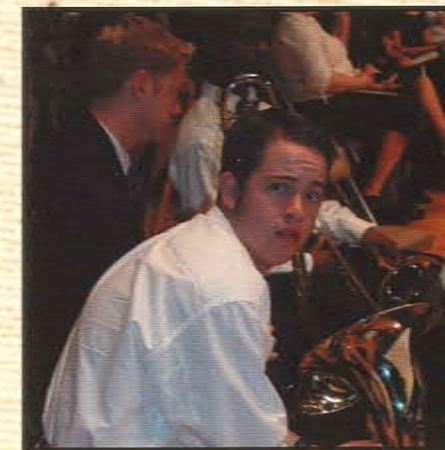
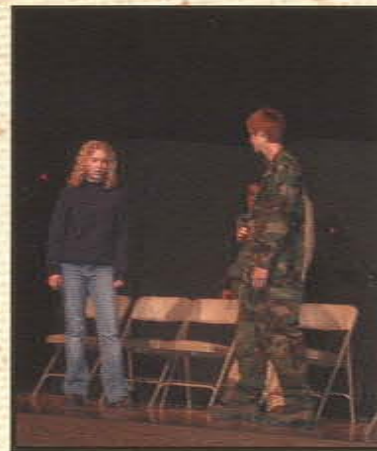
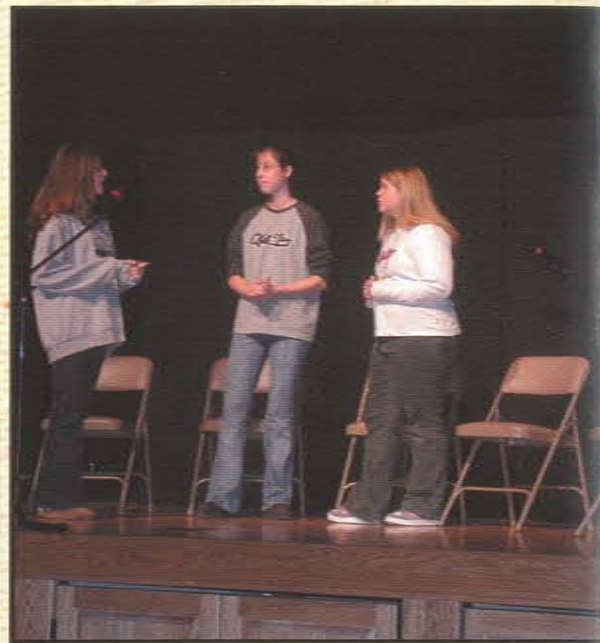
opportunity of spending time with the people of Mexico. Mexico is such a beautiful place and we had a hard time leaving. It was well worth the trip.

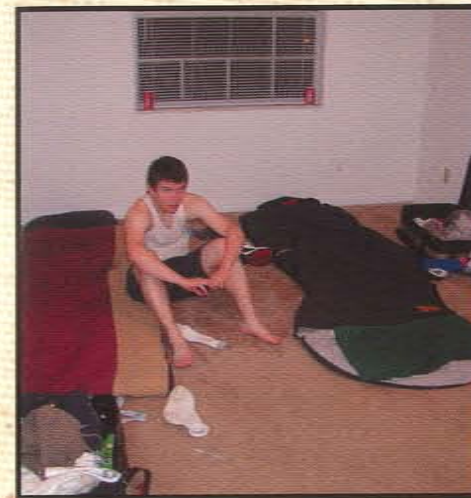
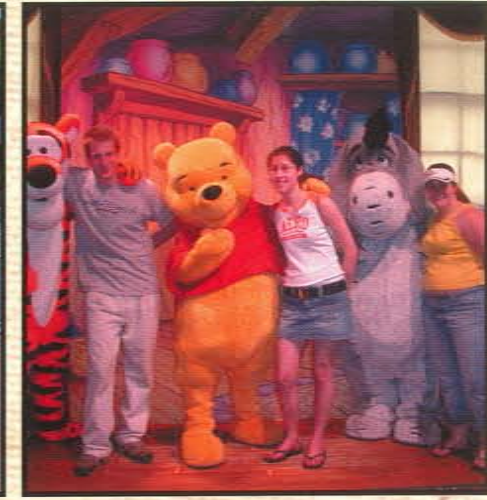


Senior Class Trip
