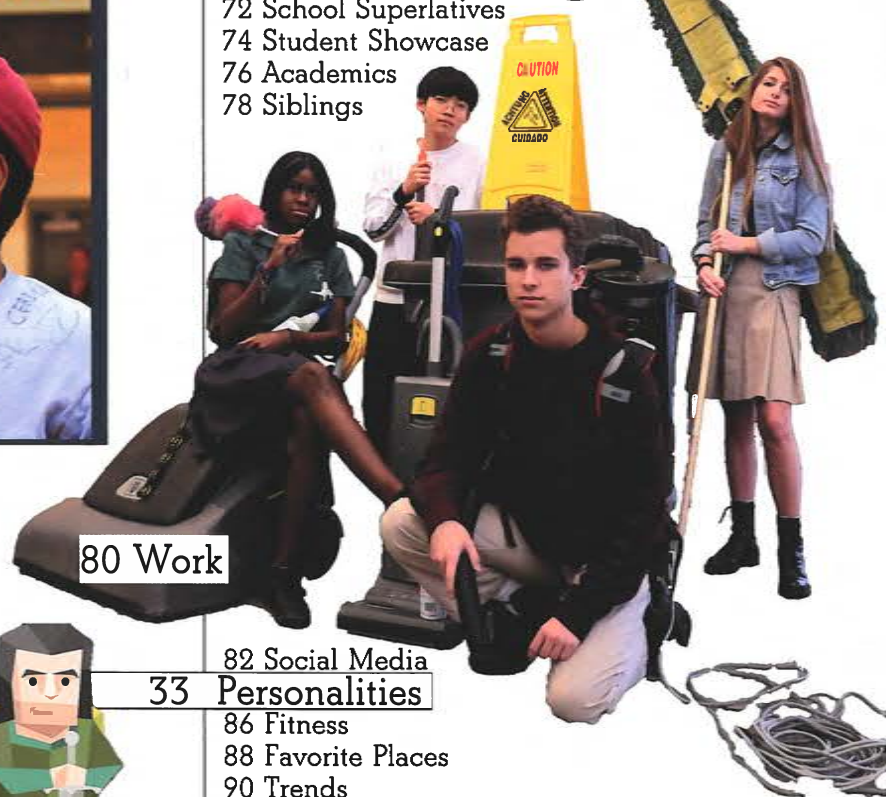

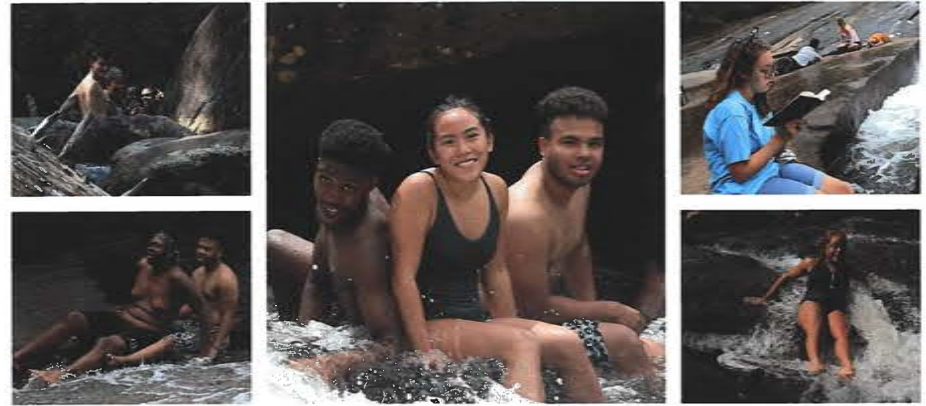
There's nothing quite like facing death to bond people together. Although many of us don't like talking about it, there's no changing what happened and how it made us grow as a class.

Bridal Veil Falls, August 18th, 2018.

Most of our class was playing around at the bottom without a care in the world. Until, looking up, they saw Kailee Chaparro and Emily Meadows coming down the waterfall. A few students had climbed up the lower portion of the falls to see an upper falls, and slide on a natural slip + slide. Kailee & Emily weren't able to get out where the others did and instead kept sliding all the way down the falls. Shock set in as they started to panic, those watching frozen in fear cried for the girls to roll out, but it was useless, they just kept going. To the people below the sight of the girl's going over took a second to sink in. Those nearby soon jumped into action. Some called for help, a group jumped to get the two scared shivering girls out and on dry land again. Others quickly grabbed those nearest to them and started praying for the efforts to get Kailee's leg unstuck from a log. To add to the stress of the situation, Lexi banged her head on a rock while hurrying to the scene and ended up with a concussion. While everyone below was jumping to action, the group that had been sliding on top quickly descended not yet knowing if the two girls were dead or alive. Amid the sobbing and somber faces there was one that drew eyes. As they helped her up in-between her tears and limping, Kailee was laughing. We remembered how to smile again. The walk back felt like a funeral march, as we all processed what had happened. Several of us struggled with blaming ourselves and with the scene running over and over through our heads, wishing we had done more.

These girls were headed to the hospital and were out of our control, but we knew a higher power was with them. Peace seemed so far away from this scene of confusion and sadness, but as the hums of "Blessings," by Laura Story, in the bus grew louder, their confidence in God was reassured. They were off to new classes and new teachers, but the unity that this incident had provided, prepared them for the upcoming year.

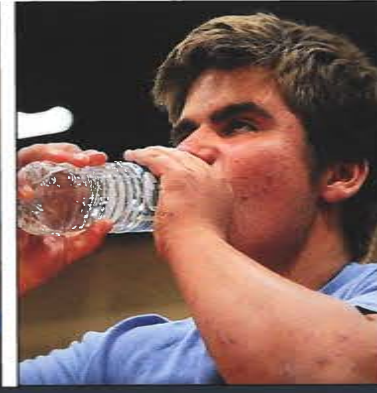
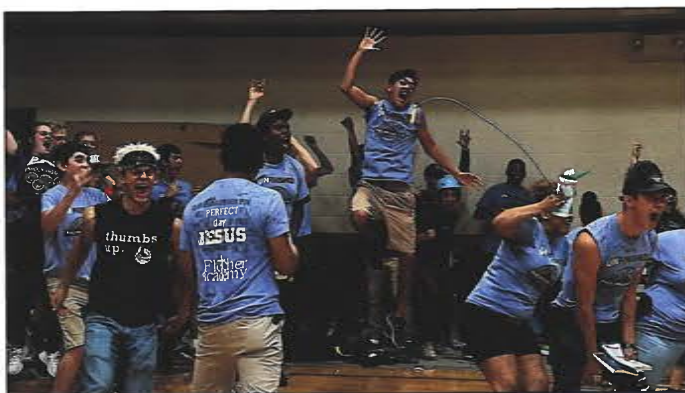

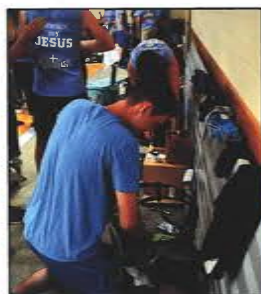


CLASS SCRAMBLE

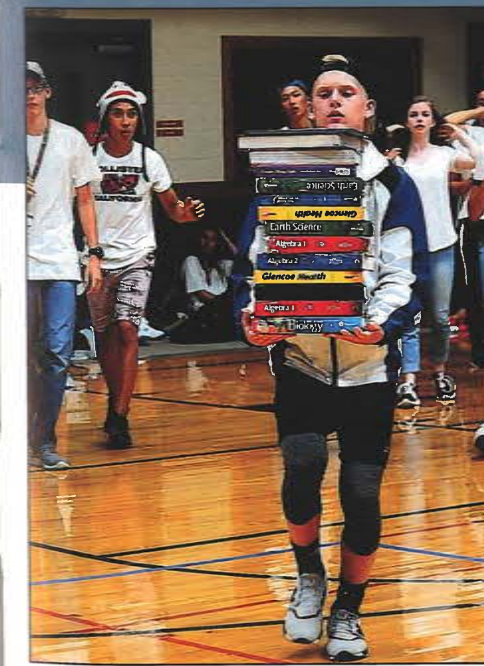
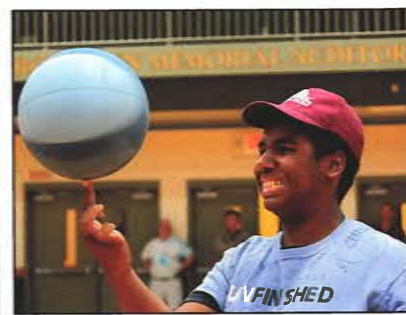

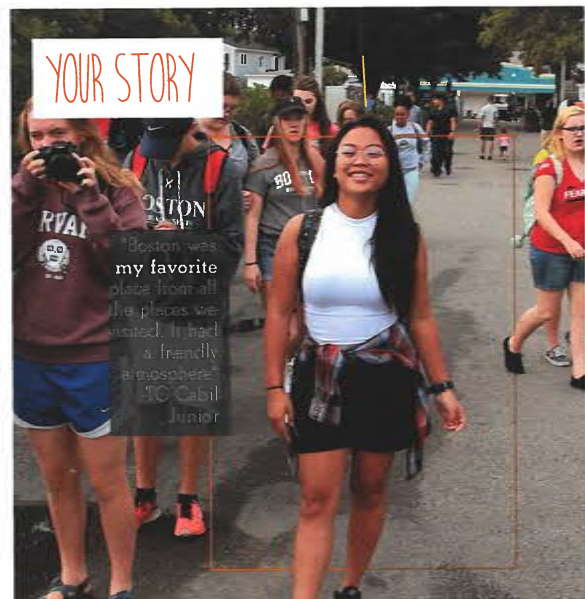

"We The Juniors..."

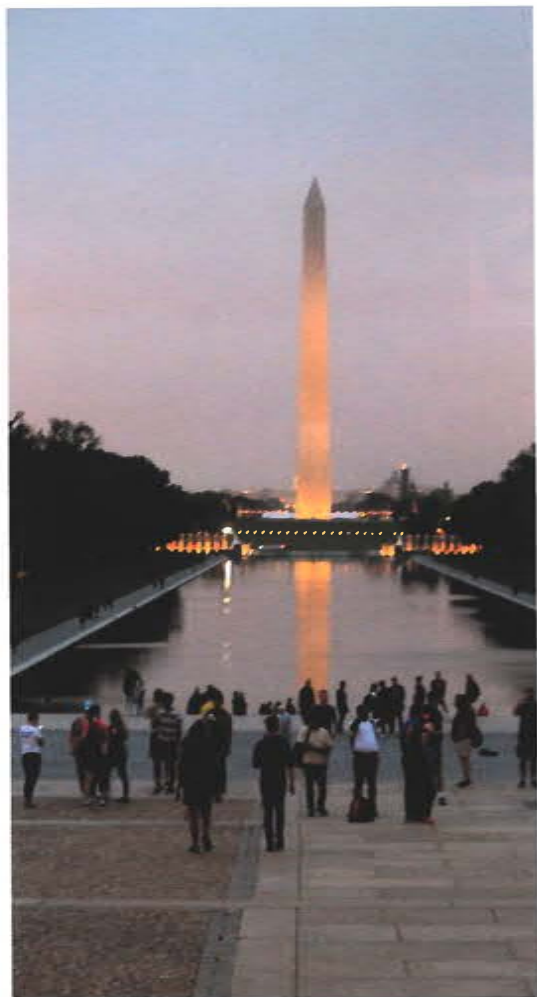

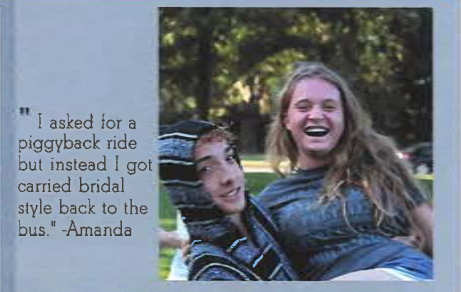


It had been a long day for the juniors when they got the news that their bus had broken down, now they knew it was going to be a long night also. There was no choice but to sleep and get comfortable.

Thailand has many traditions that vary from those in America, one of which is known as The River Festival. This specific tradition calls for the people of the community to come together and present their gratitude by making gifts.



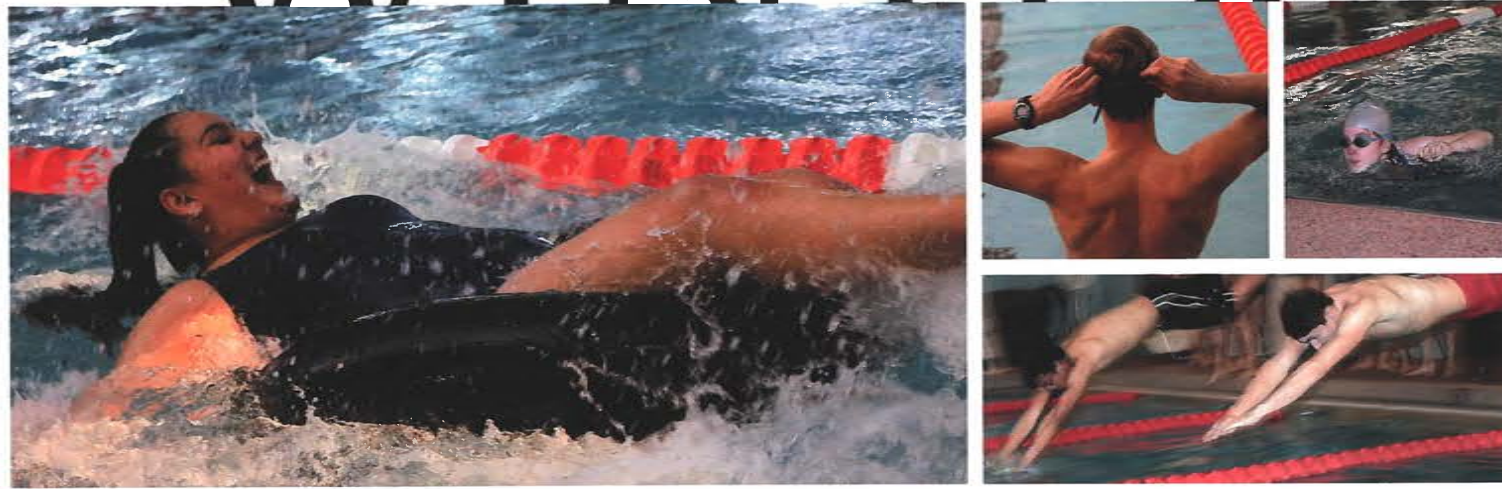
A TREK OF FAITH

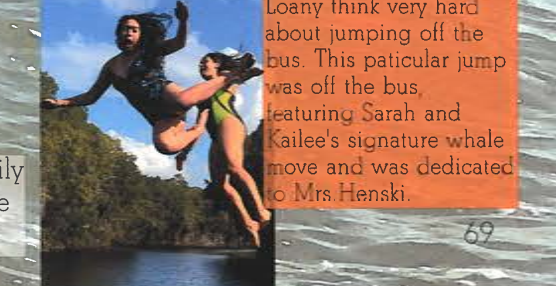


One of the kids' favorite games was to cover our eyes and make us guess which one of them it was. Once you got it right you were rewarded with hugs and love notes. They stole our hearts.

The pastor's son really latched on to Emily Meadows, and they were inseparable the whole time we were there.

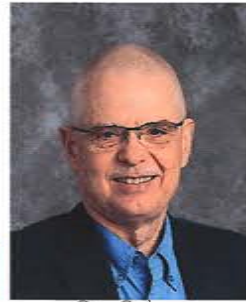

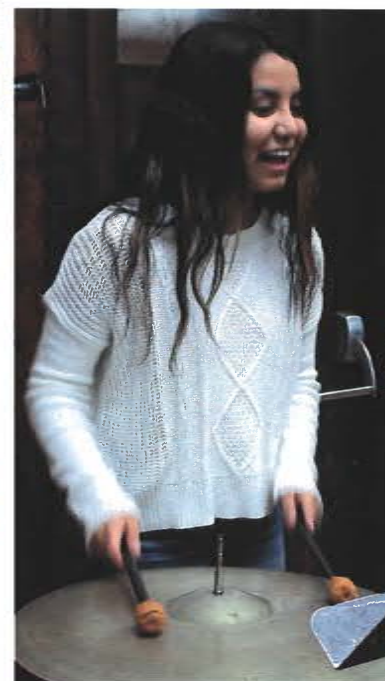


Tuned In
