




Alumni verses Student games. Many came to watch and they were not disappointed by the action they saw.

Amazing Ministries

The number one goal of Fletcher Academy is to lead our students into a saving relationship with Jesus and to help them embrace His call to discipleship. It's all about building lives for eternity.

The campus ministries team seeks to fulfill this vision. We are here to minister to the spiritual needs of the students as well as to provide ministry opportunities for them to get involved in.

Spiritual In-reach

There are many means in which to lead students into a saving relationship with Jesus. One of the new ministries we have begun this year on campus has been to incorporate a girls and boys student chaplain into each of the dormitories. These student chaplains have a ministry of visitation and prayer with the students living in the dorms. They meet weekly with me, the Academy Chaplain, to discuss how things are going and what steps can be taken to help the students in any way. Another ministry begun this year by our SA pastor Jared Ryan is the Tuesday/ Thursday devotional/prayer time in the cafeteria from 6:40-6:55 a.m. We hope to see this expand to a Monday through Friday ministry.

Sy Gallimore, a Junior, recently spearheaded a focused prayer ministry for the students on campus. His challenge was to take a list of all the students on campus and pray for at least four students per day.

It has been exciting to see the interest



in spiritual growth increase in the past month as students are recognizing the need for God's power to be in their lives. Small groups of students will be seen getting together for prayer and discussion.

Our fall week of prayer was led out by Pastor Bill Roberts. He left Fletcher Academy with a challenge to take the spiritual high one normally gets during a week of prayer and seek to continue growing. One of the ways we have done this is to match interested students up with a spiritual mentor. Church members from the Fletcher Seventh-day Adventist Church have volunteered to connect with a specific student on a weekly basis to pray with and for the student and to encourage them to continue growing in study of the word, witnessing, prayer, and fellowship.

Spiritual Outreach

Spiritual outreach is so vital to the growth of a Christian. One needs to have venues to share the information being learned and experiences being had with God to others. We seek to provide ways for the students to participate in outreach.

To date we have 19 students attending a Wednesday evening ambassadors class geared to train and equip in witnessing. This class offers hands-on ministry opportunities. The ambassadors have adopted a community in Hendersonville to focus their ministry outreach on. We have spent several Sabbath afternoons getting to know the people in this community through interaction with their children, playing games, teaching them

Bible stories and songs. We are making plans on how to minister to the adults as well.

Students have many opportunities throughout the year to become involved in sharing Jesus with others. Student week of prayer is a highlight for the campus each



year as students speak to their peers about what they believe and feel about God. We have students who lead out in church services at Beystone (a skilled nursing facility on campus) one time a month. Many students participate in the leadership of praise and worship at church, chapel or vespers.

Fletcher Academy took a day off from school this year to minister to their community. We had groups of students all over Henderson County throughout the day volunteering at places like Mainstay (a shelter for women and children), community parks, the library, Manna Food Bank; an apple orchard, and more. We had many positive responses to this day and hope to do it again soon.

It is my prayer that each student be given the opportunity to enter a saving relationship with Jesus throughout their time here at Fletcher Academy and that they be trained to share that relationship with those around them.



SACS Accreditation

Fletcher Receives Great Reviews!

In February, 2012, Fletcher Academy underwent the grueling process of becoming re-accredited through SACS (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools) which is currently under a name change to AdvancED. This process is an opportunity to find out how well a school is doing, and what steps the school might consider in becoming even better. Fletcher Academy received the full five year accreditation, the maximum allowed. Fletcher Academy administration is very pleased with the results of the accreditation, and wants to share with you some of the highlights of the final report.

Fletcher Academy received four commendations and three required actions. Here are two commendations that we are especially very proud of:

1. The sense of family which is fostered at the school and the strong relationships which result are valued by students, parents and staff.

2. The school clearly meets the mission they have established for themselves of developing students spiritually, and helping them to strengthen their personal relationship with Jesus.

For required actions we would like to share all three of them:

- 1. Build on the momentum created by the newly revised, mission-driven focus on academic rigor.
- 2. Implement plans which have been articulated in relation to campus security, and investigate other security measures which could be considered.
- 3. Initiate collaborative efforts with Captain Gilmer Christian School to include K-12 accreditation through AdvancED.

Plans are already either finished or are underway to complete all three of these required actions. Good things are happening here at Fletcher Academy and it is a privilege to be able to share them with you.



Bulging Boy's Dorm

Making More Room!

In a time when Adventist Academies are suffering from lower dormitory enrollments, Fletcher Academy is having the opposite experience. Over the past six years dormitory enrollment at Fletcher has doubled. The Girls Dorm is once again using the dorm rooms on the lower floor, and the Boys Dormitory has run out of beds causing the need for a creative solution. This school year the Worship Room of the Boys Dorm has become home for the Senior Class residents until a permanent solution can be completed. The dorm has tried various venues for their worships from hallways to lobbies, but they have settled on us-



ing the dorm Recreation Room which is less than ideal for a worship experience. The dorm residents want their worship room returned, but first a permanent solution must be accomplished.

The Boys Dormitory Dean's Residence was originally designed so that it could be converted to seven dorm rooms (14 beds) should the need arise. These extra dorm rooms are currently needed. but a solution to house the Dean is needed. Plans are underway to build a new Dean's residence, connected by means of a breezeway, to the back of the Boys Dorm. Fletcher Academy is currently raising funds for this project through donations from alumni and friends of Fletcher. Already more than \$50,000 has been raised of the estimated \$175,000 needed for this construction and renovation project. All donations for the new Dean's Residence are welcome and needed. FA Alumnus of the Year

Fletcher Academy's second Alumnus of the Year Award was given to two very special alumni: Carlton and Genella Hunt. The Hunt's heritage at Fletcher goes back to the spring of 1941, when Carlton arrived on campus. Carlton found his work in the hospital kitchen to be rewarding because of the presence of another student employee, Genella Lowder. That relationship would eventually result in the union of their two lives in marriage in 1947. After Pearl Harbor, Uncle Sam invited Carlton to join the armed services. Carlton's zeal to serve his country was matched by his desire to keep the Sabbath holy, and he suffered through much hardship and an eventual court-martial as a result. However, God blessed his steadfast faithfulness, and after serving overseas, he was one of only 15% of his unit who were given citations for excellent service. The Hunts returned to Fletcher in 1950 then eventually became involved with mission service in Uganda and

Kenya. In 1966, the Hunts returned to Fletcher Academy where they would work for 16 more years. Among their other varied responsibilities, Carlton was a teacher at the academy and Genella Director of Nursing. The Hunt's dedicated service extended from Fletcher to Africa and back. Through it all, their humble, dedicated Christian influence indeed "educated many for eternity." Truly Carlton and Genella are worthy recipients of this year's Alumnus of the Year award.

Strawberry Hill has a New Twist



In years past when folks would talk about hiking to Strawberry Hill, it usually meant going to our famous hill behind the track that always proudly displayed the Senior's graduating year. The class of 1976 was the first one to put their number on

the hill. Earlier community members say that in the 1930's there really were strawberries planted on Strawberry Hill. But now, Strawberry Hill has another meaning around campus. Now when the students and staff talk about hiking to Strawberry Hill, they are most likely talking about hiking across the street to our new frozen yogurt store. On January 2, 2013 Strawberry Hill Yogurt and Café started serving frozen vogurt and other food items to the public and our students/staff. The reviews of the food

and yogurt are coming in as fantastic!

As with other frozen yogurt stores you may have visited. Strawberry Hill Yogurt has 10 flavors and 5 blended flavors with lots of fresh fruit and other yummy toppings. The store is located on the west end of the Fletcher Valley Natural Foods plaza where the former deli and later bookstore were located. Indoor seating accommodates about 30 while outside picnic tables and benches will easily seat another 50. The "cabin" with the water-wheel formerly located on the east end of the store has been moved to become a part of the "Green" outside of Strawberry Hill Yogurt.

In addition to yogurt, Strawberry Hill Yogurt and Café serves homemade soups and delicious sandwiches from 11 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. as well as salads, drinks, and other side dishes. Pizza will be made and served from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Not only is this shop great for our community, another positive aspect is that Strawberry Hill Yogurt has created 15-20 new employment opportunities for students at Fletcher Academy.
