Students have many opportunities to be involved with the music program at the academy with multiple music groups. Band, String Ensemble, Choir, and Redemption (hand bells) groups are open to most students who enjoy performing music. Students with advanced skills also have the option to audition for Brass Ensemble, 11th Hour (vocal choir) and Exaltation (hand bells). Private music lessons in voice, piano, and multiple other instruments are offered as well. Students have the option of earning academic credit for these lessons, or just learning for personal enrichment. In addition to these groups, you can often see multiple students sharing their talents by leading out in praise singing and performing special music in worship services of area churches, Academy chapels, Academy Days Events, and highlighted often at the Fletcher Academy Alumni Weekends! These are in addition to the wonderful concerts put on by the FA Music Department for the public at the Lelia Patterson Center twice a year. They are always willing to tell others of Jesus their Lord!

The music program is not just blessing the immediate area. Band, Strings, 11th Hour and Exaltation reach out to others every year by touring to different locations. The tour list is extensive: 11th Hour and Exaltation have toured in the Atlanta Area, Gatlinburg and Eastern Tennessee, Charleston/Savannah, and Tampa, Florida. Last year, String Ensemble went to Myrtle Beach, and the Band went to Charleston. This year, 11th Hour and Exaltation will be travelling to New York City in March, and our Band is planning to tour in Savannah in April. Selected band and string ensemble members will also be participating in the Music Festival at Southern Adventist University in February.

The Music Department is excited to announce that they have upgraded two pianos in the chapel! The upgraded pianos are in the choir room and music office and will allow for a higher quality sound and better teaching tools for those that are taking lessons. Preliminary steps have been taken to renovate the three practice rooms at the Fletcher Academy Chapel. "I also enjoy working with them to choose music that speaks to a variety of moods, needs, and situations, and giving them the chance to see how their music is an opportunity for service. Interview with Kim Henski, FA Work Coordinator

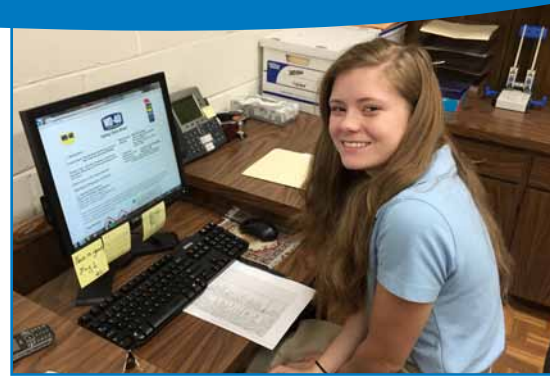
Fletcher Academy has had a longstanding, strong commitment to an integrated Work/Study Program since its very beginning in 1910. Many of the most powerful, lasting memories of the Fletcher Academy alumni are related to their work experiences. While it is one of the most challenging aspects of our overall program to coordinate, it is so much a part of our belief system and our identity that without it, we'd cease to be recognizable. There are a multitude of reasons why we believe students should be actively engaged in practical work each day, but fundamentally, the value of work goes back to Eden when God gave Adam and Eve the privilege of working. Of course, Ellen White has much counsel on students working and the value it brings to the development of a well-rounded and prepared person. We are to teach the youth "that life's true aim is not to secure the greatest possible gain for themselves, but to honor their Maker in doing their part of the world's work, and lending a helpful hand" (Education, p. 221-2).

Many students have found lifelong work habits and skills while attending Fletcher Academy. Alumni can relate as well. When one remembers their first job, the flashback is probably somewhere on the Fletcher Academy Campus. What happened in the past years of schooling is still happening today. Every student enrolled in Fletcher Academy has a job. Each student works 10-12 hours a week and even more on the weekends. They can work all over campus; Fletcher Valley Market, Fletcher Park Inn, Park Ridge Health Cafeteria, Captain Gilmer Christian School, Fletcher Academy Cafeteria, Lelia Patterson Center, Plant Services, Grounds, Dormitories, Administration Office, Accounting, Teacher Graders, and more. Students are taught many valuable skills and high work ethics. Grades are given on their transcripts for their work progress, but are not included in their final GPA's. After the rest of the money earned from working helps out with tuition costs for the year.

Fletcher Academy Inc. is a successful corporation due in part to the presence of all the great student workers. Students are energetic, mostly motivated, and cost effective. If the corporation hired adults to replace the student positions, the funding would be considerably higher. So it is a great team effort. Fletcher Academy Inc. has the student skills to tap into while the students leave with a foundation on how to be a great worker. They get that special edge of experience and confidence of knowing how to be a part of a diligent work force.

Stories have been shared how Fletcher Academy students who go on to attend Adventist Universities have an easier time getting a job. These colleges have realized that Fletcher Academy students are special and come 'work ready'! FA students apply for campus job and hear, "When can you start". One student knew there were over 60 applicants for the job she wanted. When the supervisor discovered she was a graduate of Fletcher Academy she moved her to the top of the list!

Being a good worker in the field, as Jesus says to do, is more than just a spiritual application. Being a good worker means being faithful in the everyday duties that one may find nearest to them. Be the best officer worker, be the best dish washer, be the kindest person you know when answering the phone, be the best at whatever you do. Get into the Work Zone and be a witness!

At the age of 15 our Award Recipient enrolled at FA as a sophomore dorm student. He was involved with many different activities while a student at Fletcher Academy. He also worked in a variety of positions including Fletcher Hospital and the Boys Dorm.

He spent many a day helping his favorite FA teacher, Richard Nielsen, to build his house. Gordon Brown and Don Mathis also helped to shape his life during his time as a student at Fletcher. The faculty at Fletcher helped to mold his life and he was inspired to use this same pattern with students in his dorm and classrooms, when a few years later the Lord asked him to return to Fletcher Academy as part of the faculty.

He spent 12 years molding young lives as the Dean, while also teaching several classes. In 1999, he taught 7th grade at Captain Gilmer for one year. He then moved his family to Georgia where he was the principal and teacher of an elementary school in Dalton. While there, he completed his Masters in School Administration through Western Carolina University. After 3 years in Georgia, he was called back to Fletcher to serve as the Chaplain.

He and his family returned to North Carolina in 2003, and his talents have been utilized in many different areas over the last 13 years. He has taught many different classes, wore the administrative hat at times, been challenged by the work coordinator position, and has always been involved with maintenance and vehicles. Students know him well for leading out in "Senior Survival", being their "Bus Driver", and the many mission trips that he has planned and coordinated.

Students have been inspired by him to share their talents through many local community projects, and he encourages them to be part of numerous mission trips that he has planned both at home and abroad. He has led out in the student CERT training to assist during disasters and took two groups to help with relief efforts for Hurricane Katrina victims. Everywhere you turn at Fletcher Academy, you see the lasting benefits of previous gifts to the school. One of the best examples is the annual tradition of alumni's support of the academy wish list at homecoming weekend. This last year alumni decided to fully fund the entire wish list. This has allowed the purchase of new desks, outdoor benches, a projector screen for the boys' dorm, and a 12-Passenger Van. A few projects are still in progress such as two more hide-a-benches, chapel security doors, and a cafeteria floor mixer. We are so thankful for the alumni and friends who stepped up to the plate and offered to help meet those needs.

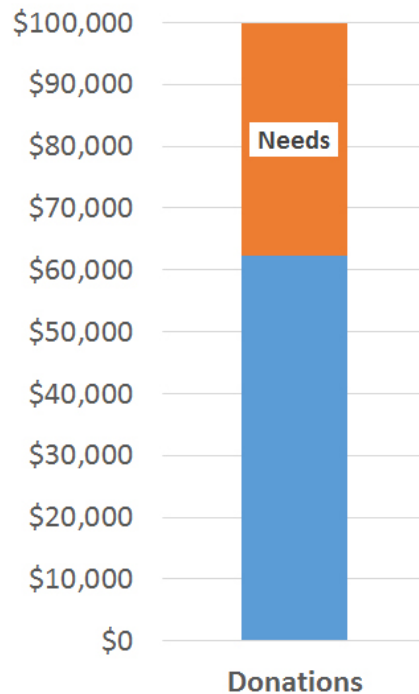
also within sight as well with over \$65,000 raised so far.

Sidney Brownsberger at 65 was more than eligible to retire after being the first founding president of two Adventist colleges. However, he decided to be of still greater service and worked until he was 75 starting another school which would become Fletcher Academy. Now his legacy of hard work is the name of one of four new endowments that were created as over \$77,000 was donated in 2016 to various named scholarship funds. The Brownsberger scholarship is especially for students who show a desire to become involved in denominational work. The Brent Yingling Scholarship is for students of proven academic excellence who participate in one of the school music groups. The Helen M. Jackson-Gibbs Scholarship is awarded to especially passionate and creative students. And the Bill Bass Mission Initiative Scholarship is awarded to each and every senior student who has participated in four years of Fletcher Academy sponsored foreign mission trips.

Scholarships are made possible by friends and alumni of Fletcher Academy for the benefit of the students at Fletcher Academy and, frequently, in memory or honor of a classmate, friend or spouse. Because of such generosity many current students are able to afford an Adventist education who may otherwise not be able to do so. 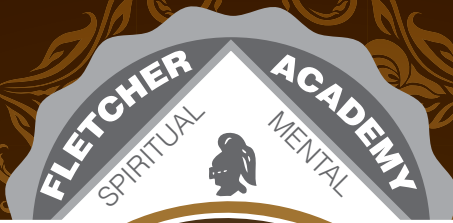

Sidney Brownsberger



Pioneer



1845-1930

Sidney Brownsberger grew up on a farm in Ohio. While a student at the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, he heard of the beliefs of Seventh-day Adventists from a young man not an Adventist. His interest was sparked, and he sent for all the literature printed by Adventists at that time. During his busy student life he spent much time in Bible study. While poring over Adventist books, he was deeply impressed with the truth. Before even meeting a Seventh-day Adventist in person, he began keeping the Sabbath alone during his junior year in college.

After graduating college, he was superintendent of schools in both Maumee and Delta, Ohio. During this time Adventists were being urged to establish their own schools for Christian education of our young people. In 1874, Professor Brownsberger accepted the urgent request of James and Ellen White to aid in the establishment of Battle Creek College in Michigan. This was the first official Seventh-day Adventist educational institution, now known as Andrews University. Professor Brownsberger is listed as their first president from 1874-1881. He also served for a time as secretary of the General Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist church.

Soon the rapidly growing churches out west began looking to build a new college in Northern California. In 1882, Brownsberger accepted the call and moved to become the first president of Healdsburg College, now known as Pacific Union College. He was known for his emphasis on practical education and Christian service.

Sadly, Brownsberger's first marriage broke down and in the spring of 1886 he resigned and moved back to Michigan, where he was self-employed for a year. In 1887, he married Edith Donaldson who had accompanied Mrs. White across the continent and lived in the White home during much of her college days at Battle Creek. Together Sidney and Edith would have three children: Ethel, John, and Sidney.

In 1894, Ellen White invited the Brownsbergers to join with her in the work in Australia. They did not go and soon, due to failing health, Sidney Brownsberger moved his family to North Carolina and acquired over 100 acres (which would later become a part of the academy). Soon afterward, Brownsberger joined with A. W. Spalding to start a new Adventist School and medical work, now known as Fletcher Academy. Classes began in 1910 with Professor Brownsberger teaching the children of the workers and the community.

Ethel and John started treatment rooms in the old plantation house in 1916. Ethel would be the first in North Carolina to take the nurse's examination receiving the highest possible grade. John would become the first registered male nurse in North Carolina and would later return to Fletcher to become the first surgeon and medical director of Mountain Sanitarium and Hospital, now known as Park Ridge Health. In time, all three children would become medical doctors.

Ellen White would write, "I have confidence in Brother Brownsberger. He is one who has humbled his heart before God, and he will prove a wise counsellor. He loves the truth" (Letter 62, 1909). And directly to Professor Brownsberger she said, "I am more than pleased that you can engage in school work and unite your influence with other workers in opening the Scriptures to those who do not understand the Word of God. I believe that the Lord has been leading you" (Letter 56, 1910).

Sidney Brownsberger was the founder and leader of what would become Fletcher Academy for its first ten years, laboring unselfishly and devotedly for the people he deeply loved. He was well educated for his day and made significant contributions to the Seventh-day Adventist Church and to the world.
